

Celebrating Easter – Introduction and Overview

This compilation of Easter scriptures is designed for reading aloud with family or friends during the weeks before and after Easter, as a way of focusing your Easter celebration on Christ. This compilation is largely based on Our Lord of the Gospels, the harmony of the gospels by J. Reuben Clark Jr. The harmony contained in A Christ Centered Easter by Janet and Joe Hales also had an influence, but the final organization was mine. I recognize that the differences in the accounts found in the various gospels cannot always be fully harmonized. I claim no expertise in scripture scholarship to justify the decisions about what was included. My experience is in theater, and I simply organized the material to produce a reading script that made sense to me.

These scriptures include almost all the events from the last week of the Savior's mortal life, His death and resurrection, that are recorded in the gospels (King James Version) and the Book of Mormon. Where an incident is recorded in more than one of the gospels, the most detailed account has been included, or

details from several accounts have been combined. Because the text moves back and forth between the various gospels, I suggest that, for continuity in reading aloud, you omit reading the citations and just focus on the text.

Hymns are included at appropriate places. The hymn numbers are from *Hymns* of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. There are also numbers from the *Children's Songbook* of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. Both are available at <u>http://www.lds.org/music?lang=eng</u>

The scriptures are listed according to the day of the week on which the recorded event occurred, but feel free to divide them up and read them according to whatever time schedule works best for you or your family. Use the section headings to select the scriptures you wish to read if you are reading with small children or if your time is limited.

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Easter Traditions:

Easter is the most sacred Holiday of the year. As parents, we wanted to help our children understand and feel its significance. Our family has always enjoyed Christmas activities, and over the years we developed a number of family traditions to make it an enjoyable and spiritually significant time of the year. But Easter, which has even more spiritual significance, often received far less attention.

We wanted to find ways to set this time apart from the rest of the year, to prepare our minds and hearts to remember the Savior's death and celebrate His resurrection. We began developing special **Easter traditions** that would bring us closer together as a family and would enhance and not

distract from the sacred nature of this experience.

As a result, the center of our family Easter celebration is our participation in the General Conference of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints, and in **family scripture reading**. Just as we read the prophesies



and accounts of the birth of the Savior at Christmastime, we have established a family tradition of reading the scriptures relating to the last week of the Saviors mortal life, His death, resurrection, and post-mortal ministry, during the weeks before and after Easter. (See the scripture compilation in the following pages.) Many of our other activities are done in conjunction with the scripture reading.

Part of our enjoyment of the Christmas season comes from the **preparation** and anticipation before Christmas Day. We have a Christmas calendar with daily activities beginning on Dec. 1. Because Easter comes at a different time each year, it can creep up on us before we are aware that it is the Easter season. We find it helpful to mark our calendars at the first of the year to remind ourselves to do Easter planning and begin preparations several weeks before Easter. We have found that with a shift in attention, many of the things we do naturally in the spring can become part of our preparations for Easter.

As we do our **spring yard work** and plant new trees, bushes, flowers and vegetables, we watch and talk about the plants returning to life from their winter dormancy.





Spring-cleaning has become focused on getting the house ready for Easter. During a Family Home Evening, we talk about how the Jews prepare for Passover by searching for leavened bread as they clean house, discarding it as a

symbol of casting sin out of their lives.

Some of the **traditional activities** that are associated with Easter may be an enjoyable part of a family Easter celebration when we focus on the symbolism involved. Growing children need new clothes on a regular basis, and spring is a natural time to buy clothes for the warm seasons. We try to get any needed church clothes for the upcoming year as part of our Easter celebration, and talk to the children about putting on **new clothes** on Easter morning as a symbol of putting on new life in the resurrection.





Decorating Easter eggs is fun and appropriate. After the destruction of the temple in Jerusalem when the Jews could no longer sacrifice the Passover lamb, they began using roasted eggs instead of lamb during their Passover meal as the symbol of the sacrifice. We hold our Easter egg hunt on Saturday in anticipation of the Easter celebration the next day.

There are many **community activities** centered around Christmas. There are fewer ready-made activities at Easter. We try to look for appropriate Easter activities that are taking place in our community and participate in them. We especially look for passion plays and concerts of Easter music.





We love the **decorations** at Christmas. They serve as a constant visual reminder of the meaning of the season. We wanted something that would do the same thing at Easter. Some people put up white lights or put candle lights in their windows at Christmas, and leave them up until Easter. Others decorate small trees with Easter ornaments or put

flower wreaths on their doors. In our home, we put up **pictures of the Savior** we have acquired from the LDS

Church Distribution Center (**www.ldscatalog.com**) and church publications. Much of the world's great art is based on the events of the last week of the Saviors mortal life, His death and resurrection. We also decorate with potted **palm trees, Easter lilies and other flowers**. We put out a large decorated basket that holds old church publications with Easter articles and stories, books, recordings of Easter music, and Easter videos.



We love Christmas stories, and have traditionally purchased a new Christmas book each year. We are now beginning to purchase **books** such as the Deseret Book publication, *Beholding Salvation*, or *The Life of Christ in Art* by Nancy

Grubb for use at Easter time. We also include such books as *Believing Christ* by Steve Robinson in our Easter book basket.



Traditional Christmas **music** helps to make Christmas time special. As we read the Easter scriptures, we enjoy singing appropriate hymns. We have also begun a tradition of buying a new recording of religious or classical music each Easter. Our current favorites are *"The Redeemer, a Sacred Service of Music"* by Robert Cundick and Mack Willburg's *Requiem*. Some of the other recordings appropriate for Easter are listed in the section on Easter Music.

We also enjoy watching videos with Easter or Passover themes, many of which are available at the LDS Church Distribution Center. You can also go to <u>biblevideos.org</u> for a wonderful resource.





Special **foods** can be an important part of celebrations. As we read the scriptures of the Passion week, we use the foods that are mentioned in the scriptures. For instance, we eat figs the second day of the week as we read of the barren fig tree.

On the fifth day of the week we hold a family **Passover Remembrance Dinner.** We read the account in Exodus 12: 1-42 of the first Passover, Psalm 113, Psalm 116 and Psalm 117 and then the New Testament scriptures relating to the



Last Supper as we eat the traditional foods included in the feast of the unleavened bread. Menus and recipes are included in the section on Easter Feasts.



On Easter morning, we read the scriptures about the resurrection at a family **sunrise service**. Fish and honeycomb, representing the foods the Savior shared with His disciples after his resurrection, make an appropriate part of an Easter dinner.

Easter Week Scripture Readings

Scriptural Accounts of Events Leading Up to the Holy Week:

Children's Songbook 34 (He Sent His Son)

Among the Book of Mormon People

Prophecy of Samuel the Lamanite 7 BC

Helaman 14:

20 But behold, as I said unto you concerning another <u>sign</u>, a sign of his death, behold, in that day that he shall suffer death the sun shall be darkened and refuse to give his light unto you; and also the moon and the stars; and there shall be no light upon the face of this land, even from the time that he shall suffer death, for the space of three days, to the time that he shall rise again from the dead.

Many Seek Him

First Day of the Week (Palm Sunday)

Triumphant Entry into Jerusalem

Prophecy - Zechariah 9:9

Luke 19:

28 And... {Jesus} went before, ascending up to Jerusalem.

29 And it came to pass, when he was come nigh to Bethphage and Bethany, at the mount called *the mount* of Olives, he sent two of his disciples,

30 Saying, Go ye into the village over against *you*; in the which at your entering ye shall find a colt tied, whereon yet never man sat: loose him, and bring *him hither*.

31 And if any man ask you, Why do ye loose *him?* thus shall ye say unto him, Because the Lord hath need of him.


Mark 11:



The Greeks Seek Him. A Voice is Heard from Heaven.

22 Philip cometh and telleth Andrew: and again Andrew and Philip tell Jesus.

32 And I, if I be lifted up from the earth, will draw all *men* unto me.

33 This he said, signifying what death he should die.

34 The people answered him, We have heard out of the law that Christ abideth for ever: and how sayest thou, The Son of man must be lifted up? who is this Son of man?

35 Then Jesus said unto them, Yet a little while is the light with you. Walk while ye have the light, lest darkness come upon you: for he that walketh in darkness knoweth not whither he goeth.


36 While ye have light, believe in the light, that ye may be the children of light. These things spake Jesus, and departed, and did hide himself from them.


14 And the blind and the lame came to him in the temple; and he healed them.

16 And said unto him, Hearest thou what these say? And Jesus saith unto them, Yea; have ye never read, Out of the mouth of babes and sucklings thou hast perfected praise?

John 12:

37 But though he had done so many miracles before them, yet they believed not on him:

38 That the saying of Esaias the prophet might be fulfilled, which he spake, Lord, who hath believed our report? and to whom hath the arm of the Lord been revealed?

39 Therefore they could not believe, because that Esaias said again,

40 He hath blinded their eyes, and hardened their heart; that they should not see with *their* eyes, nor understand with *their* heart, and be converted, and I should heal them.

41 These things said Esaias, when he saw his glory, and spake of him.

42 Nevertheless among the chief rulers also many believed on him; but because of the Pharisees they did not confess *him*, lest they should be put out of the synagogue:

43 For they loved the praise of men more than the praise of God.

44 Jesus cried and said, He that believeth on me, believeth not on me, but on him that sent me.

45 And he that seeth me seeth him that sent me.

46 I am come a light into the world, that whosoever believeth on me should not abide in darkness.

47 And if any man hear my words, and believe not, I judge him not: for I came not to judge the world, but to save the world.

48 He that <u>rejecteth</u> me, and receiveth not my words, hath one that <u>judgeth</u> him: the <u>word</u> that I have spoken, the same shall <u>judge</u> him in the last day.

49 For I have not spoken of myself; but the Father which <u>sent</u> me, he gave me a commandment, what I should say, and what I should speak.

50 And I know that his commandment is life everlasting: whatsoever I <u>speak</u> therefore, even as the <u>Father</u> said unto me, so I <u>speak</u>.

Jesus Teaches in the Temple during the Day and Returns to Bethany at Night

Luke 19:

47 And he taught daily in the temple. But the chief priests and the scribes and the chief of the people sought to destroy him,

48 And could not find what they might do: for all the people were very attentive to hear him. *Luke 21:*

37 ... and at night (*Matt. 21:17* he left them and went out of the city into Bethany) and abode in the mount that is called *the mount* of Olives.

Third and Fourth Day of the Week

Discourse on Faith

Mark 11:

20 And in the morning, as they passed by, they saw the fig tree dried up from the roots.

21 And Peter calling to remembrance saith unto him, Master, behold, the fig tree which thou cursedst is withered away.

22 And Jesus answering saith unto them, Have faith in God.

23 For verily I say unto you, That whosoever shall say unto this mountain, Be thou removed, and be thou cast into the sea; and shall not <u>doubt</u> in his heart, but shall believe that those things which he saith shall come to pass; he shall have whatsoever he saith.

24 Therefore I say unto you, What things soever ye desire, when ye <u>pray</u>, <u>believe</u> that ye receive *them*, and ye shall have *them*.

25 And when ye stand <u>praying</u>, forgive, if ye have ought against any: that your Father also which is in heaven may <u>forgive</u> you your trespasses.



26 But if ye do not <u>forgive</u>, neither will your Father which is in heaven forgive your trespasses. *Luke 21:*

37 And in the day time he was teaching in the temple...

38 And all the people came early in the morning to him in the temple, for to hear him.

Chief Priests Question Jesus' Authority



Matt. 21:

23 ¶ And when he was come into the temple, the chief priests and the elders of the people came unto him as he was teaching, and said, By what <u>authority</u> doest thou these things? and who gave thee this authority?

24 And Jesus answered and said unto them, I also will ask you one thing, which if ye tell me, I in like wise will tell you by what <u>authority</u> I do these things.

25 The baptism of John, whence was it? from heaven, or of men? And they reasoned with themselves, saying, If we shall say,

From heaven; he will say unto us, Why did ye not then believe him?

26 But if we shall say, Of men; we fear the people; for all hold John as a prophet.

27 And they answered Jesus, and said, We cannot tell. And he said unto them, Neither tell I you by what authority I do these things.

Parable of the Two Sons

Prophecy - Psalm 78:1-2

Matt. 21:

28 ¶ But what think ye? A *certain* man had two sons; and he came to the first, and said, Son, go <u>work</u> to day in my vineyard.

29 He answered and said, <u>I</u> will not: but afterward he repented, and went.

30 And he came to the second, and said likewise. And he answered and said, I go, sir: and went not.

31 Whether of them twain did the will of *his* father? They say unto him, The first. Jesus saith unto them,

Verily I say unto you, That the publicans and the harlots go into the kingdom of God before you.

32 For John came unto you in the way of <u>righteousness</u>, and ye <u>believed</u> him not: but the <u>publicans</u> and the harlots believed him: <u>and</u> ye, when ye had seen *it*, repented not afterward, that ye might believe him

Parable of the Wicked Husbandmen

Matt. 21:

33 ¶ <u>Hear</u> another parable: There was a certain householder, which planted a vineyard, and hedged it round about, and digged a winepress in it, and built a tower, and let it out to <u>husbandmen</u>, and went into a far country:

34 And when the time of the fruit drew near, he sent his servants to the husbandmen, that they might receive the fruits of it.

35 And the husbandmen took his <u>servants</u>, and <u>beat</u> one, and killed another, and stoned another.

36 Again, he sent other servants more than the first: and they did unto them likewise.



37 But last of all he sent unto them his son, saying, They will reverence my son.

38 But when the husbandmen saw the son, they said among themselves, This is the <u>heir</u>; come, let us kill him, and let us seize on his inheritance.

39 And they caught him, and cast him out of the vineyard, and slew him.

40 When the lord therefore of the vineyard cometh, what will he do unto those husbandmen?

41 They say unto him, He will miserably destroy those wicked men, and will let out *his* <u>vineyard</u> unto other husbandmen, which shall render him the fruits in their seasons.

42 Jesus saith unto them, Did ye never read in the scriptures, The <u>stone</u> which the builders <u>rejected</u>, the same is become the head of the <u>corner</u>: this is the Lord's doing, and it is marvellous in our eyes?

43 Therefore say I unto you, The <u>kingdom</u> of God shall be <u>taken</u> from you, and <u>given</u> to a <u>nation</u> bringing forth the fruits thereof.

44 <u>And</u> whosoever shall fall on this stone shall be broken: but on whomsoever it shall fall, it will grind him to powder.

45 <u>And</u> when the chief priests and Pharisees had heard his parables, they perceived that he spake of them. 46 But when they sought to lay hands on him, they feared the multitude, because they took him for a prophet.

Parable of the Marriage Feast

Matt. 22:

1 And Jesus answered and spake unto them again by parables, and said,

2 The kingdom of heaven is like unto a certain king, which made a marriage for his son,

3 And sent forth his servants to call them that were bidden to the wedding: and they would not come.

4 Again, he sent forth other servants, saying, Tell them which are bidden, Behold, I have prepared my dinner: my oxen and *my* fatlings *are* killed, and all things *are* ready: come unto the marriage.

5 But they made light of *it*, and went their ways, one to his farm, another to his merchandise:

6 And the remnant took his servants, and entreated them spitefully, and slew them.

7 But when the king heard *thereof*, he was wroth: and he sent forth his armies, and destroyed those murderers, and burned up their city.

8 Then saith he to his servants, The wedding is ready, but they which were bidden were not worthy. 9 Go ye therefore into the highways, and as many as ye shall find, bid to the marriage.



10 So those servants went out into the highways, and <u>gathered</u> together all as many as they found, both bad and good: and the wedding was furnished with guests.

11 ¶ And when the king came in to see the guests, he saw there a man which had not on a wedding garment:

12 And he saith unto him, Friend, how camest thou in hither not having a wedding garment? And he was speechless.

13 Then said the king to the servants, Bind him hand and foot, and take him away, and cast *him* into <u>outer</u> darkness; there shall be weeping and gnashing of teeth.

The Marriage Feast by Millais

14 For many are <u>called</u>, but few are <u>chosen</u>.

The Pharisees Question about Tribute

Matt. 22:

15 ¶ Then went the Pharisees, and took counsel how they might entangle him in *his* talk.

16 And they sent out unto him their disciples with the Herodians, saying, Master, we know that thou art true, and teachest the way of God in truth, <u>neither</u> carest thou for any *man:* for thou <u>regardest</u> not the person of men.

17 Tell us therefore, What thinkest thou? Is it <u>lawful</u> to give tribute unto Caesar, or not?

18 But Jesus perceived their wickedness, and said, Why tempt ye me, *ye* hypocrites?

19 Shew me the tribute money. And they brought unto him a penny.

20 And he saith unto them, Whose is this image and superscription?

21 They say unto him, Caesar's. Then saith he unto them, <u>Render</u> therefore unto <u>Caesar</u> the things which are Caesar's; and unto God the things that are God's.

22 When they had heard these words, they marvelled and left him, and went their way.



The Sadducees Question about Marriage

Mark 12:

18 ¶ Then come unto him the Sadducees, which say there is no resurrection; and they asked him, saying,

19 Master, Moses wrote unto us, If a man's brother die, and leave *his* wife *behind him*, and leave no children, that his <u>brother</u> should take his wife, and raise up seed unto his brother.

20 Now there were seven brethren: and the first took a wife, and dying left no seed.

21 And the second took her, and died,

neither left he any seed: and the third likewise.

22 And the seven had her, and left no seed: last of all the woman died also.

23 In the resurrection therefore, when they shall rise, whose wife shall she be of them? for the seven had her to wife.

24 And Jesus answering said unto them, <u>Do</u> ye not therefore err, because ye know not the scriptures, neither the power of God?

25 For when they shall rise from the dead, they neither <u>marry</u>, nor are given in marriage; but are as the angels which are in heaven.

26 And as touching the dead, that they <u>rise</u>: have ye not read in the book of Moses, how in the bush God <u>spake</u> unto him, saying, I *am* the <u>God</u> of Abraham, and the God of Isaac, and the God of Jacob?

27 He is not the God of the dead, but the God of the living: ye therefore do greatly err.

The Great Commandments

Prophecies: Deut. 6:5 & Leviticus 19: 18



Matt. 22:

34 ¶ But when the Pharisees had heard that he had put the Sadducees to silence, they were gathered together. 35 Then one of them, *which was* a lawyer, asked *him*

a question, tempting him, and saying,


36 Master, which *is* the great commandment in the law?

37 Jesus said unto him, Thou shalt <u>love</u> the Lord thy God with all thy <u>heart</u>, and with all thy soul, and with all thy <u>mind</u>.

38 This is the first and great commandment.

39 And the second *is* like unto it, Thou shalt <u>love</u> thy neighbour as thyself.

40 On these two commandments hang all the <u>law</u> and the prophets.



Mark 12:

32 And the scribe said unto him, Well, master, thou hast said the truth: for there is one God; and there is none other but he:

33 And to love him with all the heart, and with all the understanding, and with all the soul, and with all the strength, and to love his neighbor as himself, is more than all whole burnt offerings and sacrifices.

34 And when Jesus saw that he answered discreetly, he said unto him, Thou art not far from the kingdom of God. ...

Jesus Questions the Pharisees

Matt. 22:

41 ¶ While the Pharisees were gathered together, Jesus asked them,

42 Saying, What think ye of Christ? whose son is he? They say unto him, The Son of David.

43 He saith unto them, How then doth David in spirit call him Lord, saying,

44 The Lord said unto my Lord, Sit thou on my right hand, till I make thine enemies thy footstool? 45 If David then call him Lord, how is he his son?

46 And no man was able to answer him a word, neither <u>durst</u> any *man* from that day forth ask him any more *questions*.

Jesus Condemns the Works of the Scribes and Pharisees



Matt. 23:

Then spake Jesus to the multitude, and to his disciples,
 Saying, The <u>scribes</u> and the Pharisees sit in Moses' <u>seat</u>:
 All therefore whatsoever they bid you observe, *that* observe and do; but do not ye after their works: for they say, and do not.

4 For they bind heavy burdens and grievous to be borne, and lay *them* on men's shoulders; but they *themselves* will not move them with one of their fingers.

5 But all their works they do for to be seen of men: they make

broad their phylacteries, and enlarge the borders of their garments,

6 And love the uppermost rooms at feasts, and the chief seats in the synagogues,

7 And greetings in the markets, and to be called of men, Rabbi, Rabbi.

8 But be not ye called <u>Rabbi</u>: for one is your <u>Master</u>, even Christ; and all ye are brethren.

9 And call no man your father upon the earth: for one is your Father, which is in heaven.

11 But he that is greatest among you shall be your servant.

12 And whosoever shall exalt himself shall be abased; and he that shall humble himself shall be exalted.

13 But woe unto you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! for ye shut up the kingdom of heaven against men: for ye neither go in yourselves, neither suffer ye them that are entering to go in.

14 Woe unto you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! for ye devour widows houses, and for a pretense make long prayer: therefore ye shall receive the greater damnation.

23 Woe unto you, scribes and Pharisees, <u>hypocrites</u>! for ye pay <u>tithe</u> of mint and <u>anise</u> and cummin, and have <u>omitted</u> the weightier *matters* of the law, <u>judgment</u>, <u>mercy</u>, and faith: these ought ye to have done, and not to leave the other undone.

24 *Ye* blind guides, which strain at a gnat, and swallow a <u>camel</u>.

25 Woe unto you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! for ye make clean the outside of the cup and of the platter, but within they are full of <u>extortion</u> and <u>excess</u>.

26 *Thou* blind Pharisee, <u>cleanse</u> first that *which is* within the cup and platter, that the outside of them may be clean also.

27 Woe unto you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! for ye are like unto <u>whited sepulchres</u>, which indeed appear



beautiful outward, but are within full of dead men's bones, and of all uncleanness.

28 Even so ye also outwardly appear <u>righteous</u> unto men, but within ye are full of <u>hypocrisy</u> and iniquity.

29 Woe unto you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! because ye build the tombs of the prophets, and garnish the sepulchres of the righteous,

30 And say, If we had been in the days of our fathers, we would not have been partakers with them in the blood of the <u>prophets</u>.

31 Wherefore ye be witnesses unto yourselves, that ye are the children of them which killed the prophets.

32 Fill ye up then the measure of your fathers.

33 Ye serpents, ye generation of vipers, how can ye escape the damnation of hell?

34 ¶ Wherefore, behold, I send unto you <u>prophets</u>, and wise men, and <u>scribes</u>: and *some* of them ye shall kill and crucify; and *some* of them shall ye scourge in your synagogues, and persecute *them* from city to city:

35 That upon you may come all the righteous <u>blood</u> shed upon the earth, from the blood of <u>righteous</u> Abel unto the blood of Zacharias son of Barachias, whom ye slew between the <u>temple</u> and the altar.

36 Verily I say unto you, All these things shall come upon this generation.

37 O Jerusalem, Jerusalem, *thou* that <u>killest</u> the prophets, and stonest them which are sent unto thee, how often <u>would</u> I have <u>gathered</u> thy children together, even as a hen gathereth her chickens under *her* wings, and ye <u>would</u> not!

38 Behold, your house is left unto you desolate.

39 For I say unto you, Ye shall not see me henceforth, till ye shall say, <u>Blessed</u> is he that cometh in the name of the Lord.

The Widow's Mite



of her want did cast in all that she had, even all her living.

Mark 12:

41 ¶ And Jesus sat over against the treasury, and beheld how the people cast money into the treasury: and many that were rich cast in much.

42 And there came a certain <u>poor</u> widow, and she threw in two <u>mites</u>, which make a farthing.

43 And he called *unto him* his disciples, and saith unto them, Verily I say unto you, That this <u>poor</u> widow hath cast more in, than all they which have cast into the treasury:

44 For all they did cast in of their abundance; but she

The Signs of the Second Coming



JST- Matt. 24

2 And Jesus went out, and departed from the temple; and his disciples came to him, for to hear him, saying: Master, show us concerning the buildings of the temple, as thou hast said—They shall be thrown down, and left unto you desolate.

3 And Jesus said unto them: See ye not all these things, and do ye not understand them? Verily I say unto you, there shall not be left here, upon this temple, one stone upon another that shall not be thrown down.

4 And Jesus left them, and went upon the Mount of Olives. And as he sat upon the Mount of Olives, the disciples came unto him privately, saying: Tell us when shall these things be which thou hast said concerning the destruction of the temple, and the Jews; and what is the sign of thy coming, and of the end of the world, or the destruction of the wicked, which is the end of the world?

5 And Jesus answered, and said unto them: Take heed that no man deceive you;

6 For many shall come in my name, saying—I am Christ—and shall deceive many;

7 Then shall they deliver you up to be afflicted, and shall kill you, and ye shall be hated of all nations, for my name's sake;

8 And then shall many be offended, and shall betray one another, and shall hate one another;

9 And many false prophets shall arise, and shall deceive many;

10 And because iniquity shall abound, the love of many shall wax cold;

11 But he that remaineth steadfast and is not overcome, the same shall be saved.

12 When you, therefore, shall see the abomination of desolation, spoken of by Daniel the prophet, concerning the destruction of Jerusalem, then you shall stand in the holy place; whoso readeth let him understand.

13 Then let them who are in Judea flee into the mountains;

14 Let him who is on the housetop flee, and not return to take anything out of his house;

15 Neither let him who is in the field return back to take his clothes;

16 And wo unto them that are with child, and unto them that give suck in those days;

17 Therefore, pray ye the Lord that your flight be not in the winter, neither on the Sabbath day;

18 For then, in those days, shall be great tribulation on the Jews, and upon the inhabitants of Jerusalem,

such as was not before sent upon Israel, of God, since the beginning of their kingdom until this time; no, nor ever shall be sent again upon Israel.

19 All things which have befallen them are only the beginning of the sorrows which shall come upon them.

20 And except those days should be shortened, there should none of their flesh be saved; but for the elect's sake, according to the covenant, those days shall be shortened.

21 Behold, these things I have spoken unto you concerning the Jews; and again, after the tribulation of those days which shall come upon Jerusalem, if any man shall say unto you, Lo, here is Christ, or there, believe him not;

22 For in those days there shall also arise false Christs, and false prophets, and shall show great signs and wonders, insomuch, that, if possible, they shall deceive the very elect, who are the elect according to the covenant.

23 Behold, I speak these things unto you for the elect's sake; and you also shall hear of wars, and rumors of wars; see that ye be not troubled, for all I have told you must come to pass; but the end is not yet.

24 Behold, I have told you before;

25 Wherefore, if they shall say unto you: Behold, he is in the desert; go not forth: Behold, he is in the secret chambers; believe it not;

26 For as the light of the morning cometh out of the east, and shineth even unto the west, and covereth the whole earth, so shall also the coming of the Son of Man be.

27 And now I show unto you a parable. Behold, wheresoever the carcass is, there will the eagles be gathered together; so likewise shall mine elect be gathered from the four quarters of the earth.

28 And they shall hear of wars, and rumors of wars.

29 Behold I speak for mine elect's sake; for nation shall rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom; there shall be famines, and pestilences, and earthquakes, in divers places.

30 And again, because iniquity shall abound, the love of men shall wax cold; but he that shall not be overcome, the same shall be saved.

31 And again, this Gospel of the Kingdom shall be preached in all the world, for a witness unto all nations, and then shall the end come, or the destruction of the wicked;

32 And again shall the abomination of desolation, spoken of by Daniel the prophet, be fulfilled.

33 And immediately after the tribulation of those days, the sun shall be darkened, and the moon shall not give her light, and the stars shall fall from heaven, and the powers of heaven shall be shaken.

34 Verily, I say unto you, this generation, in which these things shall be shown forth, shall not pass away until all I have told you shall be fulfilled.

35 Although, the days will come, that heaven and earth shall pass away; yet my words shall not pass away, but all shall be fulfilled.

36 And, as I said before, after the tribulation of those days, and the powers of the heavens shall be shaken, then shall appear the sign of the Son of Man in heaven, and then shall all the tribes of the earth mourn; and they shall see the Son of Man coming in the clouds of heaven, with power and great glory;

37 And whoso treasureth up my word, shall not be deceived, for the Son of Man shall come, and he shall send his angels before him with the great sound of a trumpet, and they shall gather together the remainder of his elect from the four winds, from one end of heaven to the other.



38 Now learn a parable of the fig-tree—When its branches are yet tender, and it begins to put forth leaves, you know that summer is nigh at hand;

39 So likewise, mine elect, when they shall see all these things, they shall know that he is near, even at the doors;

40 But of that day, and hour, no one knoweth; no, not the angels of God in

heaven, but my Father only.

41 But as it was in the days of Noah, so it shall be also at the coming of the Son of Man;

42 For it shall be with them, as it was in the days which were before the flood; for until the day that Noah entered into the ark they were eating and drinking, marrying and giving in marriage;

43 And knew not until the flood came, and took them all away; so shall also the coming of the Son of Man be.

44 Then shall be fulfilled that which is written, that in the last days, two shall be in the field, the one shall be taken, and the other left;

45 Two shall be grinding at the mill, the one shall be taken, and the other left;

46 And what I say unto one, I say unto all men; watch, therefore, for you know not at what hour your Lord doth come.

47 But know this, if the good man of the house had known in what watch the thief would come, he would have watched, and would not have suffered his house to have been broken up, but would have been ready.

48 Therefore be ye also ready, for in such an hour as ye think not, the Son of Man cometh.

49 Who, then, is a faithful and wise servant, whom his lord hath made ruler over his household, to give them meat in due season?

50 Blessed is that servant whom his lord, when he cometh, shall find so doing; and verily I say unto you, he shall make him ruler over all his goods.

51 But if that evil servant shall say in his heart: My lord delayeth his coming,

52 And shall begin to smite his fellow-servants, and to eat and drink with the drunken,

53 The lord of that servant shall come in a day when he looketh not for him, and in an hour that he is not aware of,

54 And shall cut him as under, and shall appoint him his portion with the hypocrites; there shall be weeping and gnashing of teeth.

55 And thus cometh the end of the wicked, according to the prophecy of Moses, saying: They shall be cut off from among the people; but the end of the earth is not yet, but by and by.

Parable of the Ten Virgins



cry made, Behold, the bridegroom cometh; go ye out to meet him.

Matt. 25:

1 Then shall the kingdom of heaven be likened unto ten virgins, which took their lamps, and went forth to meet the bridegroom.

2 And five of them were wise, and five *were* foolish.

3 They that *were* foolish took their lamps, and took no oil with them:

4 But the wise took oil in their vessels with their lamps.

5 While the bridegroom tarried,they all slumbered and slept.6 And at midnight there was a

8 And the foolish said unto the wise, Give us of your oil; for our lamps are gone out.

9 But the wise answered, saying, *Not so;* lest there be not enough for us and you: but go ye rather to them that sell, and buy for yourselves.

10 And while they went to buy, the bridegroom came; and they that were ready went in with him to the marriage: and the door was shut.

11 Afterward came also the other virgins, saying, Lord, Lord, open to us.

12 But he answered and said, Verily I say unto you, I know you not.

13 Watch therefore, for ye know neither the day nor the hour wherein the Son of man cometh.

Matt. 25:

14 ¶ For *the kingdom of heaven is* as a man travelling into a far country, *who* called his own servants, and delivered unto them his goods.

15 And unto one he gave five talents, to another two, and to another one; to every man according to his several ability; and straightway took his journey.

16 Then he that had received the five talents went and traded with the same, and made *them* other five talents.

17 And likewise he that had received two, he also gained other two.



18 But he that had received one went and digged in the earth, and hid his lord's money.

19 After a long time the lord of those servants cometh, and reckoneth with them.

20 And so he that had received five talents came and brought other five talents, saying, Lord, thou deliveredst unto me five talents: behold, I have gained beside them five talents more.

21 His lord said unto him, Well done, *thou* good and faithful servant: thou hast been faithful over a few things, I

will make thee ruler over many things: enter thou into the joy of thy lord.

22 He also that had received two talents came and said, Lord, thou deliveredst unto me two talents: behold, I have gained two other talents beside them.

23 His lord said unto him, Well done, good and faithful servant; thou hast been faithful over a few things, I will make thee ruler over many things: enter thou into the joy of thy lord.

24 Then he which had received the one talent came and said, Lord, I knew thee that thou art an hard man, reaping where thou hast not sown, and gathering where thou hast not strawed:

25 And I was afraid, and went and hid thy talent in the earth: lo, there thou hast that is thine.

26 His lord answered and said unto him, *Thou* wicked and slothful servant, thou knewest that I reap where I sowed not, and gather where I have not strawed:

27 Thou oughtest therefore to have put my money to the exchangers, and *then* at my coming I should have received mine own with usury.

28 Take therefore the talent from him, and give *it* unto him which hath ten talents.

29 For unto every one that hath shall be given, and he shall have abundance: but from him that hath not shall be taken away even that which he hath.

30 And cast ye the unprofitable servant into outer darkness: there shall be weeping and gnashing of teeth.

The Final Judgment.



Matt. 25:

31 ¶ When the Son of man shall come in his glory, and all the holy angels with him, then shall he sit upon the throne of his glory:

32 And before him shall be gathered all nations: and he shall separate them one from another, as a shepherd divideth his sheep from the goats:

33 And he shall set the sheep on his right hand, but the goats on the left.

34 Then shall the King say unto them on his right hand, Come, ye blessed of my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world:

Christ the Judge by Fra Angelico

35 For I was an hungred, and ye gave me meat: I was thirsty, and ye gave me drink: I was a stranger, and ye took me in:

36 Naked, and ye clothed me: I was sick, and ye visited me: I was in prison, and ye came unto me.

37 Then shall the righteous answer him, saying, Lord, when saw we thee an hungred, and fed thee? or thirsty, and gave thee drink?

38 When saw we thee a stranger, and took thee in? or naked, and clothed thee?

39 Or when saw we thee sick, or in prison, and came unto thee?

40 And the King shall answer and say unto them, Verily I say unto you, Inasmuch as ye have done it unto one of the least of these my brethren, ye have done it unto me.

41 Then shall he say also unto them on the left hand, Depart from me, ye cursed, into everlasting fire, prepared for the devil and his angels:

42 For I was an hungred, and ye gave me no meat: I was thirsty, and ye gave me no drink:

43 I was a stranger, and ye took me not in: naked, and ye clothed me not: sick, and in prison, and ye visited me not.

44 Then shall they also answer him, saying, Lord, when saw we thee an hungred, or athirst, or a stranger, or naked, or sick, or in prison, and did not minister unto thee?

45 Then shall he answer them, saying, Verily I say unto you, Inasmuch as ye did it not to one of the least of these, ye did it not to me.

46 And these shall go away into everlasting punishment: but the righteous into life eternal.

Jesus Foretells His Betrayal. The Jewish Leaders Plot to Take Him.

Matt. 26:

1 And it came to pass, when Jesus had finished all these sayings, he said unto his disciples,

2 Ye know that after two days is *the feast of* the passover, and the Son of man is betrayed to be crucified.

3 Then assembled together the chief priests, and the scribes, and the elders of the people, unto the palace of the high priest, who was called Caiaphas,

4 And consulted that they might take Jesus by subtilty, and kill *him*. 5 But they said, Not on the feast *day*, lest there be an uproar among the people.

Mary Anoints Christ with Ointment



Matt. 26:

6 ¶ Now when Jesus was in Bethany, in the house of Simon the leper, *John 12:*

2 There they made him a supper; and Martha served: but Lazarus was one of them that sat at the table with him.

3 Then took Mary a pound of ointment of spikenard, very costly, and anointed the feet of Jesus, and wiped his feet with her hair: and the house was filled with the odour of the ointment. 4 Then saith one of his disciples, Judas Iscariot, Simon's *son*, which should betray him,

5 Why was not this ointment sold for three hundred pence, and given to the poor?

6 This he said, not that he cared for the poor; but because he was a thief, and had the bag, and bare what was put therein.


7 Then said Jesus, Let her alone: against the day of my burying hath she kept this.

15 And said *unto them*, What will ye give me, and I will deliver him unto you? And they covenanted with him for <u>thirty</u> pieces of silver. 16 And from that time he sought opportunity to <u>betray</u> him {*Luke 22:* 6 ... unto them in the absence of the multitude.}

Fifth Day of the Week

(The account of the first Passover could be read at this point as background for the Last Supper. See the Passover Scripture section.)

The Apostles Prepare for the Passover Meal

John 13:

1 Now before the feast of the passover, when Jesus knew that his hour was come that he should depart out of this world unto the Father, having loved his own which were in the world, he loved them unto the end. *Luke 22:*

7 Then came the day of unleavened bread, when the passover must be killed.

8 And he sent Peter and John, saying, Go and prepare us the passover, that we may eat.

9 And they said unto him, Where wilt thou that we prepare?

10 And he said unto them, Behold, when ye are entered into the city, there shall a man meet you, bearing a pitcher of water; follow him into the house where he entereth in.

11 And ye shall say unto the goodman of the house, The Master saith unto thee, Where is the guestchamber, where I shall eat the passover with my disciples?

12 And he shall shew you a large upper room furnished: there make ready.

13 And they went, and found as he had said unto them: and they made ready the passover.

14 And when the hour was come, he sat down, and the twelve apostles with him.

Strife Among the Disciples



Luke 22:

24 And there was also a strife among them, which of them should be accounted the greatest.

25 And he said unto them, The kings of the Gentiles exercise lordship over them; and they that exercise authority upon them are called benefactors.

26 But ye shall not be so: but he that is greatest among you, let him be as the younger; and he that is chief, as he that doth serve.

27 For whether is greater, he that sitteth at meat, or he that serveth? is not he that sitteth at meat? but I am among you as he that serveth.

Last Supper by Jouvenet

28 Ye are they which have continued with me in my temptations.

29 And I appoint unto you a kingdom, as my Father hath appointed unto me;

30 That ye may eat and drink at my table in my kingdom, and sit on thrones judging the twelve tribes of Israel.

Jesus Washes the Disciples Feet.

John 13:

3 Jesus knowing that the Father had given all things into his hands, and that he was come from God, and went to God;

4 He riseth from supper, and laid aside his garments; and took a towel, and girded himself.

5 After that he poureth water into a bason, and began to awash the disciples' feet, and to wipe them with the towel wherewith he was girded.

6 Then cometh he to Simon Peter: and Peter saith unto him, Lord, dost thou wash my feet?

7 Jesus answered and said unto him, What I do thou knowest not now; but thou shalt know hereafter.

8 Peter saith unto him, Thou shalt never wash my feet. Jesus answered him, If I wash thee not, thou hast no part with me.

9 Simon Peter saith unto him, Lord, not my feet only, but also my hands and my head.

10 Jesus saith to him, He that is washed needeth not save to wash his feet, but is clean every whit: and ye are clean, but not all.

11 For he knew who should betray him; therefore said he, Ye are not all clean.

12 So after he had washed their feet, and had taken his garments, and was set down again, he said unto them, Know ye what I have done to you?

13 Ye call me Master and Lord: and ye say well; for so I am.

14 If I then, your Lord and Master, have washed your feet; ye also ought to wash one another's feet.

15 For I have given you an example, that ye should do as I have done to you.

16 Verily, verily, I say unto you, The servant is not greater than his lord; neither he that is sent greater than he that sent him.

17 If ye know these things, happy are ye if ye do them.

Jesus Indicates His Betrayer

Prophecy - Psalm 41:9

Mark 14:

18 And as they sat and did eat, Jesus said ...

Luke 22:

15 ... unto them, With desire I have desired to eat this passover with you before I suffer:

16 For I say unto you, I will not any more eat thereof, until it be fulfilled in the kingdom of God. *John 13:*

18 I speak not of you all: I know whom I have chosen: but that the scripture may be fulfilled, He that eateth bread with me hath lifted up his heel against me.

19 Now I tell you before it come, that, when it is come to pass, ye may believe that I am he.

20 Verily, verily, I say unto you, He that receiveth whomsoever I send receiveth me; and he that receiveth me receiveth him that sent me.

21 When Jesus had thus said, he was troubled in spirit, and testified, and said, Verily, verily, I say unto you, that one of you shall betray me.



22 Then the disciples looked one on another, doubting of whom he spake.

Mark 14:

19 And they began to be sorrowful and to say unto him one by one, Is it I? and another said, Is it I?

20 And he answered and said unto them, It is one of the twelve, that dippeth with me in the dish.

21 The Son of man indeed goeth, as it is written of him: but woe to that man by whom the Son of man is betrayed! It were good for that man if he had never been born.

John 13:

23 Now there was leaning on Jesus' bosom one of his disciples, whom Jesus loved.

24 Simon Peter therefore beckoned to him, that he should ask who it should be of whom he spake.

25 He then lying on Jesus' breast saith unto him, Lord, who is it?

26 Jesus answered, He it is, to whom I shall give a sop, when I have dipped it. And when he had dipped the sop, he gave it to Judas Iscariot, the son of Simon.

Matt, 26:

25 Then Judas, which betrayed him, answered and said, Master, is it I? He said unto him, Thou hast said.

Judas Goes Out into the Night



John 13:

27 And after the sop Satan entered into him. Then said Jesus unto him, That thou doest, do quickly.

28 Now no man at the table knew for what intent he spake this unto him.

29 For some of them thought, because Judas had the bag, that Jesus had said unto him, Buy those things that we have need of against the feast; or, that he should give something to the poor.

30 He then having received the sop went immediately out: and it was night.

31 Therefore, when he was gone out, Jesus said, Now is the Son of man glorified, and God is glorified in him.

32 If God be glorified in him, God shall also glorify him in himself, and shall straightway glorify him.

33 Little children, yet a little while I am with you. Ye shall seek me: and as I said unto the Jews, Whither I go, ye cannot come; so now I say to you.

Peter Declares His Loyalty

John 13:

36 Simon Peter said unto him, Lord, whither goest thou? Jesus answered him, Whither I go, thou canst not follow me now; but thou shalt follow me afterwards.

Luke 22:

31 And the Lord said, Simon, Simon, behold, Satan hath desired to have you, that he may sift you as wheat: 32 But I have prayed for thee, that thy faith fail not: and when thou art converted, strengthen thy brethren. *Matt.26:*



31 Then saith Jesus unto them, All ye shall be <u>offended</u> because of me this night: for it is written, I will <u>smite</u> the <u>shepherd</u>, and the sheep of the flock shall be scattered abroad.

32 But after I am risen again, I will go before you into Galilee.

33 Peter answered and said unto him,

Luke 22:

33 Lord, I am ready to go with thee, both into prison, and to death. *Matt.26:*

33...Though all *men* shall be offended because of thee, *yet* will I never be <u>offended</u>.

34 Jesus said unto him, Verily I say unto thee, That this night, before the cock crow, thou shalt deny me thrice.

35 Peter said unto him, Though I should die with thee, yet will I not deny thee. Likewise also said all the disciples


John 13:

Discourse on the Comforter



John 14:

1 Let not your heart be troubled: ye believe in God, believe also in me.

2 In my Father's house are many mansions: if it were not so, I would have told you. I go to prepare a place for you.

3 And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again, and receive you unto myself; that where I am, there ye may be also. 4 And whither I go ye know, and the way ye know.

5 Thomas saith unto him, Lord, we know not whither thou goest; and how can we know the way?

6 Jesus saith unto him, I am the away, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by me.

7 If ye had known me, ye should have known my Father also: and from henceforth ye know him, and have seen him.

8 Philip saith unto him, Lord, shew us the Father, and it sufficieth us.

9 Jesus saith unto him, Have I been so long time with you, and yet hast thou not known me, Philip? he that hath seen me hath seen the Father; and how sayest thou then, Shew us the Father?

10 Believest thou not that I am in the Father, and the Father in me? the words that I speak unto you I speak not of myself: but the Father that dwelleth in me, he doeth the works.

11 Believe me that I am in the Father, and the Father in me: or else believe me for the very works' sake.

12 Verily, verily, I say unto you, He that believeth on me, the works that I do shall he do also; and greater works than these shall he do; because I go unto my Father.

13 And whatsoever ye shall ask in my name, that will I do, that the Father may be glorified in the Son.

14 If ye shall ask any thing in my name, I will do it.

15 If ye love me, keep my commandments.

16 And I will pray the Father, and he shall give you another Comforter, that he may abide with you for ever;

17 Even the Spirit of truth; whom the world cannot receive, because it seeth him not, neither knoweth him: but ye know him; for he dwelleth with you, and shall be in you.

18 I will not leave you comfortless: I will come to you.

19 Yet a little while, and the world seeth me no more; but ye see me: because I live, ye shall live also.

20 At that day ye shall know that I am in my Father, and ye in me, and I in you.

21 He that hath my commandments, and keepeth them, he it is that loveth me: and he that loveth me shall be loved of my Father, and I will love him, and will manifest myself to him.

22 Judas saith unto him, not Iscariot, Lord, how is it that thou wilt manifest thyself unto us, and not unto the world?

23 Jesus answered and said unto him, If a man love me, he will keep my words: and my Father will love him, and we will come unto him, and make our abode with him.

24 He that loveth me not keepeth not my sayings: and the word which ye hear is not mine, but the Father's which sent me.

25 These things have I spoken unto you, being yet present with you.

26 But the Comforter, which is the Holy Ghost, whom the Father will send in my name, he shall teach you all things, and bring all things to your remembrance, whatsoever I have said unto you.

27 Peace I leave with you, my peace I give unto you: not as the world giveth, give I unto you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid.

28 Ye have heard how I said unto you, I go away, and come again unto you. If ye loved me, ye would rejoice, because I said, I ago unto the Father: for my Father is greater than I.

29 And now I have told you before it come to pass, that, when it is come to pass, ye might believe.

No Greater Love...

John 15:

1 I am the true <u>vine</u>, and my Father is the husbandman.

2 Every <u>branch</u> in me that beareth not <u>fruit</u> he taketh away: and every *branch* that beareth fruit, he <u>purgeth</u> it, that it may bring forth more fruit.

3 Now ye are clean through the word which I have spoken unto you.

4 <u>Abide</u> in me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit of itself, except it abide in the vine; no more can ye, except ye abide in me.

5 I am the <u>vine</u>, ye *are* the branches: He that abideth in me, and I in him, the same bringeth forth much fruit: for without <u>me</u> ye can do nothing.

6 If a man <u>abide</u> not in me, he is cast forth as a branch, and is withered; and men gather them, and cast *them* into the fire, and they are burned.

7 If ye <u>abide</u> in me, and my words abide in you, ye shall <u>ask</u> what ye will, and it shall be done unto you.

8 Herein is my Father glorified, that ye bear much fruit; so shall ye be my disciples.

9 As the Father hath <u>loved</u> me, so have I loved you: continue ye in my love.

10 If ye <u>keep</u> my commandments, ye shall abide in my <u>love</u>; even as I have kept my Father's commandments, and abide in his love.

11 These things have I spoken unto you, that my joy might remain in you, and *that* your joy might be full.

12 This is my commandment, That ye <u>love</u> one another, as I have <u>loved</u> you.

13 Greater <u>love</u> hath no man than this, that a man lay down his <u>life</u> for his <u>friends</u>.

14 Ye are my friends, if ye do whatsoever I command you.

15 Henceforth I call you not servants; for the servant knoweth not what his lord doeth: but I have called you <u>friends</u>; for all things that I have <u>heard</u> of my Father I have made <u>known</u> unto you.

16 Ye have not chosen me, but I have <u>chosen</u> you, and <u>ordained</u> you, that ye should go and bring forth <u>fruit</u>, and *that* your fruit should remain: that whatsoever ye shall ask of the Father in my <u>name</u>, he may give it you.

Children's Songbook 74 (I Feel My Savior's Love)

Christ Again Foretells His Death

John 16:

1 These things have I spoken unto you, that ye should not be offended.

2 They shall put you out of the synagogues: yea, the time cometh, that whosoever <u>killeth</u> you will think that he doeth God service.

3 And these things will they do unto you, because they have not known the Father, nor me.

4 But these things have I told you, that when the time shall come, ye may remember that I told you of them. And these things I said not unto you at the beginning, because I was with you.

5 But now I ago my way to him that sent me; and none of you asketh me, Whither goest thou?

6 But because I have said these things unto you, sorrow hath filled your heart.

7 Nevertheless I tell you the truth; It is <u>expedient</u> for you that I go away: for if I go not away, the <u>Comforter</u> will not come unto you; but if I depart, I will send him unto you.

8 And when he is come, he will reprove the world of sin, and of righteousness, and of judgment:

9 Of sin, because they believe not on me;

10 Of righteousness, because I go to my Father, and ye see me no more;

11 Of judgment, because the prince of this world is judged.

12 I have yet many things to <u>say</u> unto you, but ye cannot <u>bear</u> them now.

13 Howbeit when he, the <u>Spirit</u> of truth, is come, he will <u>guide</u> you into all <u>truth</u>: for he shall not speak of himself; but whatsoever he shall hear, *that* shall he speak: and he will <u>shew</u> you things to come.

14 He shall <u>glorify</u> me: for he shall receive of mine, and shall shew *it* unto you.

15 All <u>things</u> that the <u>Father</u> hath are mine: therefore said I, that he shall take of mine, and shall shew *it* unto you.

16 A little while, and ye shall not see me: and again, a little while, and ye shall <u>see</u> me, because I go to the Father.

17 Then said *some* of his disciples among themselves, What is this that he saith unto us, A little while, and ye shall not see me: and again, a little while, and ye shall see me: and, Because I go to the Father?

18 They said therefore, What is this that he saith, A little while? we cannot tell what he saith.

19 Now Jesus knew that they were desirous to ask him, and said unto them, Do ye enquire among vourselves of that I said, A little while, and ye shall not see me: and again, a little while, and ye shall see me?

20 Verily, verily, I say unto you, That ye shall weep and lament, but the world shall rejoice: and ye shall be sorrowful, but your <u>sorrow</u> shall be turned into joy.

21 A <u>woman</u> when she is in travail hath sorrow, because her hour is come: but as soon as she is delivered of the child, she remembereth no more the anguish, for joy that a man is born into the world.

22 And ye now therefore have <u>sorrow</u>: but I will see you again, and your heart shall rejoice, and your joy no man taketh from you.

23 And in that day ye shall ask me nothing. <u>Verily</u>, verily, I say unto you, Whatsoever ye shall <u>ask</u> the Father in my name, he will give *it* you.

24 Hitherto have ye asked nothing in my name: ask, and ye shall receive, that your joy may be full.

25 These things have I spoken unto you in <u>proverbs</u>: but the time cometh, when I shall no more speak unto you in proverbs, but I shall shew you plainly of the Father.

26 At that day ye shall ask in my name: and I say not unto you, that I will pray the Father for you:

27 For the Father himself <u>loveth</u> you, because ye have loved me, and have <u>believed</u> that I came out from God.

28 I <u>came forth</u> from the <u>Father</u>, and am come into the world: again, I leave the world, and go to the Father. 29 His disciples said unto him, Lo, now speakest thou plainly, and speakest no proverb.

30 Now are we sure that thou <u>knowest</u> all things, and needest not that any man should ask thee: by this we believe that thou camest forth from God.

31 Jesus answered them, Do ye now believe?

32 Behold, the hour cometh, yea, is now come, that ye shall be scattered, every man to his own, and shall leave me alone: and yet I am not <u>alone</u>, because the Father is with me.

33 These things I have spoken unto you, that in me ye might have <u>peace</u>. In the <u>world</u> ye shall have <u>tribulation</u>: but be of good <u>cheer</u>; I have <u>overcome</u> the world.

The Intercessory Prayer

John 17:

1 These words spake Jesus, and lifted up his eyes to heaven, and said, Father, the hour is come; glorify thy Son, that thy Son also may glorify thee:

2 As thou hast given him <u>power</u> over all flesh, that he should give <u>eternal</u> life to as many as thou hast <u>given</u> him.

3 And this is <u>life eternal</u>, that they might <u>know</u> thee the only true <u>God</u>, and Jesus Christ, whom thou hast <u>sent</u>.

4 I have <u>glorified</u> thee on the earth: I have <u>finished</u> the work which thou gavest me to do.

5 And now, O Father, glorify thou me with thine

own self with the glory which I had with thee before the world was.

6 I have manifested thy name unto the men which thou gavest me <u>out</u> of the world: thine they were, and thou gavest them me; and they have kept thy word.

7 Now they have known that all things whatsoever thou hast given me are of thee.

8 For I have given unto them the <u>words</u> which thou gavest me; and they have received *them*, and have known surely that I <u>came</u> out from thee, and they have <u>believed</u> that thou didst send me.

9 I pray for them: I pray not for the world, but for them which thou hast given me; for they are thine.

10 And all mine are thine, and thine are mine; and I am glorified in them.

11 And now I am no more in the world, but these are in the <u>world</u>, and I come to thee. Holy Father, keep through thine own name those whom thou hast given me, that they may be <u>one</u>, as we *are*.

12 While I was with them in the world, I kept them in thy name: those that thou gavest me I have kept, and <u>none</u> of them is <u>lost</u>, but the son of <u>perdition</u>; that the scripture might be fulfilled.

13 And now come I to thee; and these things I speak in the world, that they might have my joy fulfilled in themselves.

14 I have given them thy word; and the world hath hated them, because they are not of the world, even as I am not of the world.

15 I pray not that thou shouldest take them out of the <u>world</u>, but that thou shouldest <u>keep</u> them from the <u>evil</u>.

16 They are not of the world, even as I am not of the world.



17 <u>Sanctify</u> them through thy <u>truth</u>: thy word is <u>truth</u>.

18 As thou hast sent me into the world, even so have I also sent them into the world.

19 And for their sakes I sanctify myself, that they also might be sanctified through the truth.

20 Neither pray I for these alone, but for them also which shall believe on me through their word;

21 That they all may be <u>one</u>; as thou, <u>Father</u>, *art* in me, and I in thee, that they also may be <u>one</u> in us: that the world may believe that thou hast sent me.

22 And the glory which thou gavest me I have given them; that they may be <u>one</u>, even as we are <u>one</u>:

23 I in them, and thou in me, that they may be made <u>perfect</u> in one; and that the world may know that thou hast sent me, and hast <u>loved</u> them, as thou hast loved me.

24 Father, I will that they also, whom thou hast given me, be with me where I am; that they may behold my glory, which thou hast given me: for thou lovedst me before the foundation of the world.

25 O righteous Father, the world hath not <u>known</u> thee: but I have known thee, and these have known that thou hast sent me.

26 And I have <u>declared</u> unto them thy <u>name</u>, and will declare *it*: that the <u>love</u> wherewith thou hast <u>loved</u> me may be in them, and I in them.

Prophecy – Isaiah 53:12

Luke 22:

35 And he said unto them, When I sent you without purse, and scrip, and shoes, lacked ye any thing? And they said, Nothing.

36 Then said he unto them, But now, he that hath a purse, let him take it, and likewise his scrip: and he that hath no sword, let him sell his garment, and buy one.



37 For I say unto you, that this that is written must yet be accomplished in me, And he was reckoned among the transgressors: for the things concerning me have an end.

44 And being in an <u>agony</u> he prayed more earnestly: <u>and</u> his sweat was as it were great drops of <u>blood</u> falling down to the ground.

The Disciples Sleep

Prophecy - Psalm 69:20

Luke 22:

45 And when he rose up from prayer...: *Matt.* 26

40 ... he cometh unto the disciples, and findeth them <u>asleep</u>, and saith unto Peter, What, <u>could</u> ye not watch with me one hour?

41 <u>Watch</u> and <u>pray</u>, that ye enter not into <u>temptation</u>: the spirit indeed *is* willing, but the flesh *is* weak.



42 He went away again the second time, and prayed, saying, O my Father, if this cup may not pass away from me, except I drink it, thy <u>will</u> be done.

43 And he came and found them asleep again: for their eyes were heavy.

44 And he left them, and went away again, and prayed the third time, saying the same words.

45 Then cometh he to his disciples, and saith unto them, Sleep on now, and take *your* rest: behold, the hour is at hand, and the Son of man is <u>betrayed</u> into the hands of sinners.

46 Rise, let us be going: behold, he is at hand that doth betray me.

2 And Judas also, which betrayed him, knew the place: for Jesus ofttimes resorted thither with his disciples.

3 Judas then, having received a band *of men* and officers from the chief priests and Pharisees, cometh thither with lanterns and torches and weapons.

Matt. 26:

48 Now he that betrayed him gave them a sign, saying, Whomsoever I shall kiss, that same is he: hold him fast.

49 And <u>forthwith</u> he came to Jesus, and said, Hail, master; and kissed him.

50 And Jesus said unto him, Friend, wherefore art thou come?

Luke 22:

48...Judas, betrayest thou the Son of man with a kiss?



John 18:

4 Jesus therefore, knowing all things that should come upon him, went forth, and said unto them, Whom seek ye?

51 And Jesus answered and said, Suffer ye thus far. And he touched his ear, and <u>healed</u> him. *Matt.* 26:

52 Then said Jesus unto {Simon Peter}, Put up again thy sword into his place: for all they that take the sword shall <u>perish</u> with the sword.

53 Thinkest thou that I cannot now pray to my Father, and he shall presently give me more than twelve legions of angels?

54 But how then shall the scriptures be fulfilled, that thus it must be?

55 In that same hour said Jesus to the multitudes, Are ye come out as against a thief with swords and staves for to take me? I sat daily with you <u>teaching</u> in the temple, and ye laid no hold on me.

56 But all this was done, that the scriptures of the prophets might be fulfilled. Then all the disciples forsook him, and fled.

Mark 14:

51 And there followed him a certain young man, having a linen cloth cast about his naked body; and the young men laid hold on him.

52 And he left the linen cloth, and fled from them naked.


Jesus before Annas and Caiaphas

John 18:

12 Then the band and the captain and officers of the Jews took Jesus, and bound him,

13 And led him away to <u>Annas</u> first; for he was father in law to Caiaphas, which was the high priest that same year.

14 Now <u>Caiaphas</u> was he, which gave counsel to the Jews, that it was expedient that one man should die for the people.




20 Jesus answered him, I spake openly to the world; I ever taught in the synagogue, and in the temple, whither the Jews always resort; and in secret have I said nothing.

21 Why askest thou me? ask them which heard me, what I have said unto them: behold, they know what I said.

22 And when he had thus spoken, one of the officers which stood by <u>struck</u> Jesus with the palm of his hand, saying, Answerest thou the high priest so?

The Night Examination



Mark 14:

65 Then the high priest rent his clothes, saying, He hath spoken <u>blasphemy</u>; what further need have we of witnesses? behold, now ye have heard his blasphemy.

66 What think ye? They answered and said, He is guilty of death.

Jesus Mocked

Matt. 16:

67 Then did they spit in his face; and buffeted him. *Luke 22:*

63 And the men that held Jesus mocked him, and smote him.

64 And when they had <u>blindfolded</u> him, they struck him on the face, and asked him, saying, Prophesy, who is it that smote thee?


65 And many other things blasphemously spake they against him

Peter Denies Him.

John 18:

15 ¶ And Simon Peter followed Jesus, and *so did* another disciple: that disciple was known unto the high priest, and went in with Jesus into the palace of the high priest.

16 But Peter stood at the door without. Then went out that other disciple, which was known unto the high priest, and spake unto her that kept the door, and brought in Peter.



Luke 22:

55 And when they had kindled a fire in the midst of the <u>hall</u>, and were set down together, Peter sat down among them.

56 But a certain maid beheld him as he sat by the fire, and earnestly looked upon him, and said, This man was also with him.

57 And he denied him, saying, Woman, I know him not. 58 And after a little while another saw him, and said, Thou art also of them. And Peter said, Man, I am not. 59 And about the space of one hour after another confidently affirmed, saying, Of a truth this *fellow* also was with him: for he is a Galilaean.

60 And Peter said, Man, I know not what thou sayest. And immediately, while he yet spake, the cock crew.

61 And the <u>Lord</u> turned, and looked upon Peter. And Peter remembered the word of the Lord, how he had said unto him, Before the cock crow, thou shalt deny me thrice.

62 And Peter went out, and wept bitterly.

Judas Hangs Himself



Matt. 27:

1 When the morning was come, all the chief priests and elders of the people took counsel against Jesus to put him to death:

2 And when they had bound him, they led him away,....

3¶ Then Judas, which had betrayed him, when he saw that he was condemned, repented himself, and brought again the thirty pieces of silver to the chief priests and elders,

4 Saying, I have sinned in that I have <u>betrayed</u> the innocent <u>blood</u>. And they said, What *is that* to us? <u>see</u> thou *to that*.

5 And he cast down the pieces of silver in the temple, and departed, and went <u>and hanged</u> himself.

6 And the chief priests took the silver pieces, and said, It is not lawful for to put them into the treasury, because it is the price of blood.

7 And they took counsel, and bought with them the <u>potter</u>'s field, to bury <u>strangers</u> in.

8 Wherefore that field was called, The field of blood, unto this day.

9 Then was fulfilled that which was spoken by Jeremy the prophet, saying, And they took the <u>thirty</u> pieces of silver, the price of him that was valued, whom they of the children of Israel did value;

10 And gave them for the potter's field, as the Lord appointed me.

Jesus Taken to Pilate

John 18:

 $28 \ \mbox{\ } \mbox{\ }$

29 Pilate then went out unto them, and said, What accusation bring ye against this man?

30 They answered and said unto him, If he were not a malefactor, we would not have delivered him up unto thee.

31 Then said Pilate unto them, Take ye him, and judge him according to your law. The Jews therefore said unto him, It is not lawful for us to put any man to death:

32 That the saying of Jesus might be fulfilled, which he spake, signifying what death he should die. *Luke 22:*

2 And they began to accuse him, saying, We found this fellow perverting the nation and forbidding to give tribute to Caesar, and saying that he himself is Christ a King.



Pilate Examines Him



John 18:

33 Then Pilate entered into the judgment hall again, and calledJesus, and said unto him, Art thou the King of the Jews?34 Jesus answered him, Sayest thou this thing of thyself, or didothers tell it thee of me?

35 Pilate answered, Am I a Jew? Thine own nation and the chief priests have delivered thee unto me: what hast thou done? 36 Jesus answered, My kingdom is not of this world: if my

kingdom were of this world, then would my servants fight, that I should not be delivered to the Jews: but now is my kingdom not from hence.

37 <u>Pilate</u> therefore said unto him, Art thou a <u>king</u> then? Jesus answered, Thou sayest that I am a <u>king</u>. To this end was I born, and for this cause came I into the world, that I should bear witness unto the <u>truth</u>. Every one that is of the truth heareth my voice.

38 Pilate saith unto him, What is truth? And when he had <u>said</u> this, he went out again unto the Jews, and saith unto them, I find in him no <u>fault at all</u>.

Mark 14:

3 And the chief priests accused him of many things, but he answered nothing.

4 And Pilate asked him again, saying, Answerest thou nothing? behold how many things they witness against thee.

5 But Jesus yet answered nothing so that Pilate marveled.

Before Herod

Luke 23:

5 And they were the more fierce, saying, He stirreth up the people, teaching throughout all Jewry, beginning from Galilee to this place.

6 When Pilate heard of Galilee, he asked whether the man were a Galilaean.

7 And as soon as he knew that he belonged unto Herod's jurisdiction, he sent him to Herod, who himself also was at Jerusalem at that time.

8 And when Herod saw Jesus, he was exceeding glad: for he was desirous to see him of a long *season*, because he had heard many things of him; and he hoped to have seen some <u>miracle</u> done by him.

9 Then he questioned with him in many words; but he <u>answered</u> him nothing.

10 And the chief priests and scribes stood and vehemently accused him.

11 And Herod with his men of war set him at nought, and <u>mocked</u> *him*, and arrayed him in a gorgeous robe, and sent him again to Pilate.

12 And the same day Pilate and Herod were made friends together: for before they were at enmity between themselves.

Before Pilate Again

Matt. 27:

19 ¶ When {Pilate} was set down on the judgment seat, his wife sent unto him, saying, Have thou nothing to do with that just man: for I have suffered many things this day in a <u>dream</u> because of him.



Luke 23:

13 And Pilate, when he had called together the chief priests and the rulers and the people,

14 Said unto them, Ye have brought this man unto me, as one that perverteth the people: and, behold, I, having examined *him* before you, have found no fault in this man touching those things whereof ye accuse him:

15 No, nor yet Herod: for I sent you to him; and, lo, nothing worthy of death is done <u>unto</u> him.

16 I will therefore chastise him, and release *him*. *Matt.* 27

15 Now at *that* feast the governor was <u>wont</u> to <u>release</u> unto the people a prisoner, whom they <u>would</u>.

16 And they had then a notable prisoner, called Barabbas.

17 Therefore when they were gathered together, Pilate said unto them, Whom will ye that I release unto you? Barabbas, or Jesus which is called Christ?

18 For he knew that for envy they had delivered him.

Priests Persuade the People to Ask for the release of Barrabas.

Matt. 27:

20 But the chief <u>priests</u> and elders <u>persuaded</u> the multitude that they should <u>ask</u> Barabbas, and destroy Jesus.

Luke 23:

18 And they cried out all at once, saying, Away with this man, and release unto us Barabbas:

19 (Who for a certain sedition made in the city, and for murder, was cast into prison.)

20 Pilate therefore, willing to release Jesus, spake again to them.

21 But they cried, saying, Crucify him, crucify him.

22 And he said unto them the third time, Why, what evil hath he done? I have found <u>no</u> cause of death in him: I will therefore chastise him, and let *him* go.

John 19:

1 ... Pilate therefore took Jesus and scourged him.

The Soldiers Mock Him

Matt. 27:

27 Then the soldiers of the governor took Jesus into the <u>common</u> hall, {*Mark 15: 16* called Preatorium} and gathered unto him the whole band *of soldiers*.

28 And they stripped him, and put on him a scarlet robe.

29 And when they had <u>platted</u> a crown of thorns, they put *it* upon his head, and a <u>reed</u> in his right hand: and they bowed the knee before him, and mocked him, saying, Hail, King of the Jews! *Mark 15:*

19 And they smote him on the head with {the} reed, and did spit upon him, and bowing their knees worshipped him.

Pilate Seeks Again to Release Him

8 ¶ When Pilate therefore heard that saying, he was the more afraid;

9 And went again into the judgment hall, and saith unto Jesus, Whence art thou? But Jesus gave him no answer.

10 Then saith Pilate unto him, Speakest thou not unto me? knowest thou not that I have power to crucify thee, and have power to release thee?

11 Jesus answered, Thou couldest have no <u>power</u> *at all* against me, except it were given thee from above: therefore he that delivered me unto thee hath the greater <u>sin</u>.

12 And from thenceforth Pilate sought to release him: but the Jews cried out, saying, If thou let this man go, thou art not Caesar's friend: whosoever maketh himself a king speaketh against Caesar.

13 \P When Pilate therefore heard that saying, he brought Jesus forth, and sat down in the judgment seat in a place that is called the Pavement, but in the Hebrew, Gabbatha.

14 And it was the preparation of the <u>passover</u>, and about the sixth hour: and he saith unto the Jews, Behold your <u>King</u>!

15 But they cried out, Away with *him*, away with *him*, <u>crucify</u> him. Pilate saith unto them, Shall I crucify your King? The chief priests answered, We have no <u>king</u> but Caesar.

Matt. 27:

24 ¶ When Pilate saw that he <u>could</u> prevail nothing, but *that* rather a <u>tumult</u> was made, he took water, and washed *his* hands before the multitude, saying, I am innocent of the blood of this just person: see ye *to it*.

25 Then answered all the people, and said, His <u>blood</u> be on us, and on our children. Luke 24:

24 And Pilate gave sentence that it should be as they required.

Matt. 27:

26 Then released he Barabbus unto them, and ... he delivered {Jesus} to be crucified.

John 19:

4 Pilate therefore went forth again, and saith unto them, Behold, I bring him forth to you, that ye may know that I find no <u>fault</u> in him.

5 Then came Jesus forth, wearing the crown of thorns, and the purple robe. And *Pilate* saith unto them, Behold the man!

6 When the chief priests therefore and officers saw him, they <u>cried</u> out, saying, Crucify *him*, crucify *him*. Pilate saith unto them, Take ye him, and crucify *him*: for I find no <u>fault</u> in him. 7 The Jews answered him, We have a <u>law</u>, and by our law he ought to die, because he made himself the <u>Son</u> of God.



They Take Him to Golgotha

Matt. 27:

31 And ... {the soldiers} took the robe off from him, and put his own raiment on him, and led him away to crucify *him*.

Luke 23:

26 And as they led him away, they laid hold upon one Simon, a Cyrenian, coming out of the country, and on him they laid the cross, that he might bear *it* after Jesus.

27 And there followed him a great company of people, and of women, which also bewailed and lamented him.



28 But Jesus turning unto them said, Daughters of <u>Jerusalem</u>, weep not for me, but weep for yourselves, and for your children.

29 For, behold, the days are coming, in the which they shall say, Blessed *are* the <u>barren</u>, and the wombs that never bare, and the paps which never gave suck.

30 Then shall they begin to say to the mountains, Fall on us; and to the hills, Cover us.

31 For if they do these things in a green tree, what shall be done in the dry?

Mark 15:

22 And they bring him unto the place Golgotha, which is, being interpreted, The place of a skull.

Prophecy - Psalm 22:16 & Isa. 53: 12.




Matt. 27:

34 They gave him <u>vinegar</u> to drink mingled with gall: and when he had tasted *thereof*, he would not drink. *Luke 23:*

32 And there were also two other, <u>malefactors</u>, led with him to be put to death.



33 And when they were come to the place, which is called Calvary, there they crucified him, and the malefactors, one on the right hand, and the other on the left.



Mark 15:


25And it was the third hour...

21 Then said the chief priests of the Jews to Pilate, Write not, The King of the Jews; but that he said, I am King of the Jews. 22 Pilate answered, What I have written I have written.

The Soldiers Part His Garments

Prophecy – Psalm 22: 18

John 19:

23 ¶ Then the soldiers, when they had crucified Jesus, took his garments, and made four parts, to every soldier a part; and also *his* coat: now the coat was without seam, woven from the top throughout.

24 They said therefore among themselves, Let us not rend it, but cast lots for it, whose it shall be: that the scripture might be fulfilled, which saith, They parted my <u>raiment</u> among them, and for my vesture they did cast lots. These things therefore the soldiers did.

Bystanders Mock Him

Prophecy - Psalm 22: 7 - 8

Matt. 27:

9 And they that passed by <u>reviled</u> him, wagging their heads, 40 And saying, Thou that destroyest the temple, and

buildest *it* in three days, save thyself. If thou be the <u>Son</u> of God, come down from the cross.

41 Likewise also the chief priests mocking him, with the scribes and elders, said,

42 He saved others; himself he cannot save. If he be the King of Israel, let him now come down from the cross, and we will believe him.

43 He trusted in God; let him deliver him now, if he will have him: for he said, I am the Son of God.



Thieves Converse with Jesus

Luke 23:

39 And one of the malefactors which were hanged <u>railed</u> on him, saying, If thou be Christ, save thyself and us.

40 But the other answering rebuked him, saying, Dost not thou fear God, seeing thou art in the same condemnation?

41 And we indeed justly; for we receive the due <u>reward</u> of our deeds: but this man hath done nothing amiss.

42 And he said unto Jesus, Lord, remember me when thou comest into thy kingdom.

43 And Jesus said unto him, Verily I say unto thee, To day shalt thou be with me in paradise.

Jesus Gives His Mother into John's Care



John 19:

25 Now there stood by the cross of Jesus his <u>mother</u>, and his mother's sister, Mary the *wife* of <u>Cleophas</u>, and Mary Magdalene.

26 When Jesus therefore saw his mother, and the <u>disciple</u> standing by, whom he loved, he saith unto his mother, <u>Woman</u>, behold thy son!

27 Then saith he to the disciple, Behold thy <u>mother</u>! And from that hour that disciple took her unto his own *home*.

Fourth Words From the Cross

Prophecy - Psalm 22:1

Luke 23:

44 And it was about the <u>sixth</u> hour, and there was a <u>darkness</u> over all the <u>earth</u> until the ninth hour.

Matt. 27:

46 And about the ninth hour Jesus cried with a loud voice, saying, Eli, Eli, lama sabachthani? that is to say, <u>My</u> God, my God, why hast thou <u>forsaken</u> me?

47 Some of them that stood there, when they heard *that*, said, This *man* calleth for <u>Elias</u>.

Atonement Finished. Christ Dies

John 19:

28 After this, Jesus knowing that all things were now accomplished, that the scripture might be fulfilled, saith, I thirst.

29 Now there was set a vessel full of vinegar: and they filled a spunge with vinegar, and put *it* upon hyssop, and put *it* to his mouth.

Matt. 27:

49 The rest said, Let be, let us see whether Elias will come to save him.



John 19:

30 When Jesus therefore had received the vinegar, he said, It is finished...

Luke 23:

46 And when Jesus had cried with a loud voice, he said, Father, into thy hands I <u>commend</u> my <u>spirit</u>: and having said thus, he <u>gave</u> up the <u>ghost</u>.

34 But one of the soldiers with a spear pierced his side, and forthwith came there out blood and water.



Matt. 27:

61 And there was Mary Magdalene, and the other Mary, ... *Luke 23:*

56 And they returned, and prepared spices and ointments; and <u>rested</u> the sabbath day according to the commandment.

3 Nephi 8:

13 And the <u>highways</u> were broken up, and the level roads were spoiled, and many smooth places became rough.

14 And many great and notable cities were <u>sunk</u>, and many were <u>burned</u>, and many were shaken till the buildings thereof had fallen to the earth, and the inhabitants thereof were slain, and the places were left desolate.

15 And there were some cities which remained; but the damage thereof was exceedingly great, and there were many in them who were slain.

16 And there were some who were carried away in the <u>whirlwind</u>; and whither they went no man knoweth, save they know that they were carried away.

17 And thus the face of the whole earth became deformed, because of the tempests, and the thunderings, and the lightnings, and the quaking of the earth.

18 And behold, the rocks were rent in twain; they were broken up upon the face of the whole earth, insomuch that they were <u>found</u> in broken fragments, and in seams and in cracks, upon all the face of the land.

19 And it came to pass that when the thunderings, and the lightnings, and the storm, and the tempest, and the quakings of the earth did cease—for behold, they did last for about the space of <u>three hours</u>; and it was said by some that the time was greater; nevertheless, all these great and terrible things were done in about the space of three hours—and then behold, there was <u>darkness</u> upon the face of the land.

20 And it came to pass that there was thick darkness upon all the face of the land, insomuch that the inhabitants thereof who had not fallen could <u>feel</u> the <u>vapor</u> of darkness;

21 And there could be no light, because of the darkness, neither candles, neither torches; neither could there be fire kindled with their fine and exceedingly dry wood, so that there could not be any light at all;

22 And there was not any light seen, neither fire, nor glimmer, neither the sun, nor the moon, nor the stars, for so great were the mists of darkness which were upon the face of the land.

23 And it came to pass that it did last for the space of three days that there was no light seen; and there was great mourning and <u>howling</u> and weeping among all the people continually; yea, great were the groanings of the people, because of the darkness and the great destruction which had come upon them.

24 And in one place they were heard to cry, saying: O that we had repented <u>before</u> this great and terrible day, and then would our brethren have been spared, and they would not have been <u>burned</u> in that great city Zarahemla.


25 And in another place they were heard to cry and mourn, saying: O that we had repented before this great and terrible day, and had not killed and stoned the prophets, and cast them out; then would our mothers and our fair daughters, and our children have been spared, and not have been buried up in that great city <u>Moronihah</u>. And thus were the howlings of the people great and terrible.

11 And because they did cast them all out, that there were none righteous among them, I did send down ^a<u>fire</u> and destroy them, that their wickedness and abominations might be hid from before my <u>face</u>, that the blood of the prophets and the saints whom I sent among them might not cry unto me <u>from</u> the ground against them.

12 And <u>many</u> great destructions have I caused to come upon this land, and upon this people, because of their wickedness and their abominations.

13 O all ye that are <u>spared</u> because ye were more <u>righteous</u> than they, will ye not now return unto me, and repent of your sins, and be converted, that I may <u>heal</u> you?

14 Yea, verily I say unto you, if ye will <u>come</u> unto me ye shall have <u>eternal</u> life. Behold, mine <u>arm</u> of mercy is extended towards you, and whosoever will come, him will I receive; and blessed are those who come unto me.

15 Behold, I am Jesus Christ the Son of God. I <u>created</u> the heavens and the earth, and all things that in them are. I was with the Father from the beginning. <u>I</u> am in the Father, and the Father in me; and in me hath the Father glorified his name.

16 I came unto my own, and my own <u>received</u> me not. And the scriptures <u>concerning</u> my coming are fulfilled.

17 And as many as have received me, to them have I given to become the sons of God; and even so will I to as many as shall believe on my name, for behold, by me redemption cometh, and in me is the law of Moses fulfilled.

18 I am the light and the life of the world. I am Alpha and Omega, the beginning and the end.

19 And ye shall offer up unto me <u>no</u> more the shedding of blood; yea, your sacrifices and your burnt offerings shall be done away, for I will accept none of your sacrifices and your burnt offerings.

20 And ye shall offer for a <u>sacrifice</u> unto me a broken heart and a contrite spirit. And whoso cometh unto me with a broken heart and a contrite spirit, him will I <u>baptize</u> with fire and with the Holy Ghost, even as the Lamanites, because of their faith in me at the time of their conversion, were baptized with fire and with the Holy Ghost, and they knew it not.

21 Behold, I have come unto the world to bring redemption unto the world, to save the world from sin.

22 Therefore, whoso <u>repenteth</u> and cometh unto me <u>as</u> a <u>little</u> child, him will I receive, for of such is the kingdom of God. Behold, for such I have <u>laid</u> down my life, and have taken it up again; therefore repent, and come unto me ye ends of the earth, and be saved.

3 Nephi 10:

1 And now behold, it came to pass that all the people of the land did <u>hear</u> these sayings, and did witness of it. And after these sayings there was silence in the land for the space of many hours;

2 For so great was the astonishment of the people that they did cease lamenting and howling for the loss of their kindred which had been slain; therefore there was silence in all the land for the space of many hours.

3 And it came to pass that there came a voice again unto the people, and all the people did hear, and did witness of it, saying:

4 O ye people of these <u>great</u> cities which have fallen, who are descendants of Jacob, yea, who are of the house of Israel, how oft have I <u>gathered</u> you as a hen gathereth her chickens under her wings, and have <u>nourished</u> you.

5 And again, how oft would I have gathered you as a hen gathereth her chickens under her wings, yea, O ^a<u>ye</u> people of the house of Israel, who have fallen; yea, O ye people of the house of Israel, ye that dwell at Jerusalem, as ye that have fallen; yea, how oft would I have gathered you as a hen gathereth her chickens, and ye would not.

6 O ye house of Israel whom I have <u>spared</u>, how oft will I gather you as a hen gathereth her chickens under her wings, if ye will repent and <u>return</u> unto me with full purpose of <u>heart</u>.

7 But if not, O house of Israel, the places of your dwellings shall become <u>desolate</u> until the time of the fulfilling of the <u>covenant</u> to your fathers.

8 And now it came to pass that after the people had heard these words, behold, they began to weep and howl <u>again</u> because of the loss of their kindred and friends.

Christ Appears to Mary Magdalene

John 20:

1 The <u>first</u> *day* of the week cometh Mary Magdalene early, when it was yet <u>dark</u>, unto the sepulchre, and seeth the <u>stone</u> taken away from the <u>sepulchre</u>.

2 Then she runneth, and cometh to Simon Peter, and to the other <u>disciple</u>, whom Jesus loved, and saith unto them, They have taken away the <u>Lord</u> out of the sepulchre, and we know not where they have laid him.



3 Peter therefore went forth, and that other disciple, and came to the sepulchre.

4 So they ran both together: and the other disciple did outrun Peter, and came first to the sepulchre.

5 And he stooping down, and looking in, saw the linen clothes lying; yet went he not in.

6 Then cometh Simon Peter following him, and went into the sepulchre, and seeth the linen clothes lie,

7 And the <u>napkin</u>, that was about his head, not lying with the linen clothes, but wrapped together in a place by itself.

8 Then went in also that other disciple, which came first to the sepulchre, and he saw, and believed.

9 For as yet they knew not the scripture, that he must ^arise again from the <u>dead</u>.

10 Then the disciples went away again unto their own home.



14 And when she had thus said, she turned herself back, and <u>saw</u> Jesus standing, and knew not that it was Jesus.

15 Jesus saith unto her, Woman, why weepest thou? whom seekest thou? She, supposing him to be the gardener, saith unto him, Sir, if thou have borne him hence, tell me where thou hast laid him, and I will take him away.

16 Jesus saith unto her, Mary. She turned herself, and saith unto him, Rabboni; which is to say, <u>Master</u>.

17 Jesus saith unto her, <u>Touch</u> me not; for I am not yet <u>ascended</u> to my <u>Father</u>: but go to my brethren, and say unto them, I ascend unto my <u>Father</u>, and your Father; and *to* my God, and your God.

18 Mary Magdalene came and told the disciples that she had seen the Lord and that he had spoken these things unto her. 11 But Mary stood without at the sepulchre weeping: and as she wept, she stooped down, *and looked* into the sepulchre,

12 And seeth two <u>angels</u> in white sitting, the one at the head, and the other at the feet, where the body of Jesus had lain.

13 And they say unto her, Woman, why weepest thou? She saith unto them, Because they have taken away my Lord, and I know not where they have laid him.



6 He is not here, but is ^arisen: remember how he spake unto you when he was yet in Galilee,

7 Saying, The Son of man must be delivered into the hands of sinful men, and be crucified, and the third day rise again.

Matt. 28:

6 ... Come, see the place where the Lord lay.

7 And go quickly, and tell his disciples that he is risen from the dead; and, behold, he goeth before you into Galilee; there shall ye see him: lo, I have told you.

8 And they departed quickly from the sepulchre with fear and great joy; and did run to bring his disciples word.

10 Then said Jesus unto them, Be not afraid: go tell my brethren that they go into Galilee, and there shall they see me.

16 But their eyes were holden that they should not know him.

17 And he said unto them, What manner of communications *are* these that ye have one to another, as ye walk, and are sad?

18 And the one of them, whose name was <u>Cleopas</u>, answering said unto him, Art thou only a stranger in Jerusalem, and hast not known the things which are come to pass there in these days?

19 And he said unto them, What things? And they said unto him, Concerning Jesus of Nazareth, which was a prophet mighty in deed and word before God and all the people:

20 And how the chief priests and our rulers delivered him to be condemned to death, and have crucified him.

21 But we trusted that it had been he which should have redeemed Israel: and beside all this, to day is the third day since these things were done.

22 Yea, and certain women also of our company made us astonished, which were early at the sepulchre;

23 And when they found not his body, they came, saying, that they had also seen a vision of angels, which said that he was alive.

24 And certain of them which were with us went to the sepulchre, and found *it* even so as the women had said: but him they saw not.


25 Then he said unto them, O fools, and slow of heart to believe all that the prophets have spoken:

26 Ought not Christ to have suffered these things, and to enter into his glory?

29 But they constrained him, saying, Abide with us: for it is toward evening, and the day is far spent. And he went in to tarry with them.




30 And it came to pass, as he sat at meat with them, he took bread, and blessed *it*, and brake, and gave to them.

John 20:






Christ Pantocrator



Thomas Doubts



John 20:

24 But Thomas, one of the twelve, called Didymus, was not with them when Jesus came.

25 The other disciples therefore said unto him, We have seen the Lord. But he said unto them, Except I shall see in his hands the <u>print</u> of the nails, and put my finger into the print of the nails, and thrust my hand into his side, I will not believe.

26 And after eight days again his disciples were within, and Thomas with them: *then* came Jesus, the doors being shut, and stood in the midst, and said, Peace *be* unto you.

27 Then saith he to Thomas, Reach hither thy finger, and behold my hands; and reach hither thy hand, and <u>thrust *it*</u> into my side: and be not <u>faithless</u>, but <u>believing</u>.

28 And Thomas answered and said unto him, My Lord and my God.

29 Jesus saith unto him, Thomas, because thou hast <u>seen</u> me, thou hast believed: <u>blessed</u> *are* they that have not seen, and *yet* have <u>believed</u>.

Jesus Eats Fish with the Disciples at the Sea of Tiberias



John 21:

1 After these things Jesus <u>shewed</u> himself again to the disciples at the sea of Tiberias; and on this wise shewed he *himself*.

2 There were together Simon Peter, and Thomas called Didymus, and Nathanael of Cana in Galilee, and the *sons* of <u>Zebedee</u>, and two other of his disciples.

3 Simon Peter saith unto them, I go a fishing. They say unto him, We also go with thee. They went forth, and entered into a ship immediately; and that night they caught nothing.

4 But when the morning was now come, Jesus <u>stood</u> on the shore: but the disciples knew not that it was Jesus.

5 Then Jesus saith unto them, Children, have ye any meat? They answered him, No.

6 And he said unto them, Cast the net on the right side of the ship, and ye shall find. They cast therefore, and now they were not able to draw it for the multitude of fishes.

7 Therefore that disciple whom Jesus loved saith unto Peter, It is the Lord. Now when Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he girt *his* fisher's coat *unto him*, (for he was naked,) and did cast himself into the sea.

8 And the other disciples came in a little ship; (for they were not far from land, but as it were two hundred cubits,) dragging the net with fishes.

9 As soon then as they were come to land, they saw a fire of coals there, and fish laid thereon, and bread.

10 Jesus saith unto them, Bring of the fish which ye have now caught.

11 Simon Peter went up, and drew the net to land full of great fishes, an hundred and fifty and three: and for all there were so many, yet was not the net broken.





12 Jesus saith unto them, Come *and* dine. And none of the disciples durst ask him, Who art thou? knowing that it was the Lord.

13 Jesus then cometh, and taketh bread, and giveth them, and fish likewise.

14 This is now the <u>third</u> time that Jesus <u>shewed</u> himself to his disciples, after that he was risen from the dead.

Jesus Commands Peter to Feed His Sheep

John 21:

15 So when they had dined, Jesus saith to Simon Peter, Simon, *son* of Jonas, lovest thou me more than these? He saith unto him, Yea, Lord; thou knowest that I love thee. He saith unto him, Feed my lambs.

16 He saith to him again the second time, Simon, *son* of Jonas, lovest thou me? He saith unto him, Yea, Lord; thou knowest that I love thee. He saith unto him, <u>Feed</u> my sheep.

17 He saith unto him the third time, Simon, *son* of Jonas, lovest thou me? Peter was grieved because he said unto him the third time, Lovest thou me? And he said unto him, Lord, thou knowest all things; thou knowest that I love thee. Jesus saith unto him, <u>Feed</u> my <u>sheep</u>.

18 Verily, verily, I say unto thee, When thou wast young, thou girdedst thyself, and walkedst whither thou wouldest: but when thou shalt be <u>old</u>, thou shalt stretch forth thy hands, and another shall gird thee, and carry *thee* whither thou wouldest not.

19 This spake he, signifying by what <u>death</u> he should glorify God. And when he had spoken this, he saith unto him, Follow me.

20 Then Peter, turning about, seeth the disciple whom Jesus loved following; which also leaned on his breast at supper, and said, Lord, which is he that betrayeth thee?

21 Peter seeing him saith to Jesus, Lord, and what shall this man do?

22 Jesus saith unto him, If I will that he tarry till I come, what is that to thee? follow thou me.

23 Then went this saying abroad among the brethren, that that disciple should not <u>die</u>: yet Jesus said not unto him, He shall not die; but, If I will that he tarry till I come, what *is that* to thee?

1 Cor. 15:

6 After that, he was <u>seen</u> of <u>above</u> five hundred brethren at once; of whom the greater part remain unto this present, but some are fallen asleep.

7 After that, he was seen of James; then of all the apostles.

Jesus Teaches the Disciples 40 Days and Commands Them to Do Missionary Work

Matt 28:

16 \P Then the eleven disciples went away into Galilee, into a mountain where Jesus had appointed them.

18 And <u>Jesus</u> came and spake unto them, saying, All <u>power</u> is given unto me in heaven and in earth.

19 Go ye therefore, and <u>teach</u> all <u>nations</u>, <u>baptizing</u> them in the name of the <u>Father</u>, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost:

20 <u>Teaching</u> them to <u>observe</u> all things whatsoever I have <u>commanded</u> you: and, lo, I am <u>with</u> you alway, *even* unto the <u>end</u> of the world.

2 Until the day in which he was taken up, after that he through the Holy Ghost had given <u>commandments</u> unto the apostles whom he had chosen:

3 To whom also he <u>shewed</u> himself alive after his <u>passion</u> by many infallible proofs, being seen of them forty days, and speaking of the things <u>pertaining</u> to the kingdom of God:

Jesus Appears to Nephites

3 Nephi 10:

1 And now it came to pass that there were a great multitude <u>gathered</u> together, of the people of Nephi, round about the temple which was in the land <u>Bountiful</u>; and they were marveling and wondering one with another, and were showing one to another the <u>great</u> and marvelous change which had taken place.

2 And they were also conversing about this Jesus Christ, of whom the <u>sign</u> had been given concerning his death.

3 And it came to pass that while they were thus conversing one with another, they heard a <u>voice</u> as if it came out of heaven; and they cast their eyes round about, for they understood not the voice which they heard; and it was not a harsh voice, neither was it a loud voice; nevertheless, and notwithstanding it being a <u>small</u> voice it did <u>pierce</u> them that did hear to the center, insomuch that there was no part of their frame that it did not cause to quake; yea, it did pierce them to the very soul, and did cause their hearts to burn.

4 And it came to pass that again they heard the voice, and they <u>understood</u> it not.

5 And again the third time they did hear the voice, and did <u>open</u> their ears to hear it; and their eyes were towards the sound thereof; and they did look steadfastly towards heaven, from whence the sound came.

6 And behold, the third time they did understand the voice which they heard; and it said unto them:

7 Behold my Beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased, in whom I have glorified my name—hear ye him.

8 And it came to pass, as they understood they cast their eyes up again towards heaven; and behold, they <u>saw</u> a Man <u>descending</u> out of heaven; and he was clothed in a white robe; and he came down and stood in the midst of them; and the eyes of the whole multitude were turned upon him, and they durst not open their mouths, even one to another, and wist not what it meant, for they thought it was an angel that had appeared unto them.

9 And it came to pass that he stretched forth his hand and spake unto the people, saying:

10 Behold, I am Jesus Christ, whom the prophets testified shall come into the world.

11 And behold, I am the ^a<u>light</u> and the life of the world; and I have drunk out of that bitter <u>cup</u> which the Father hath given me, and have glorified the Father in <u>taking</u> upon me the sins of the world, in the which I have suffered the <u>will</u> of the Father in all things from the beginning.

12 And it came to pass that when Jesus had spoken these words the whole multitude <u>fell</u> to the earth; for they remembered that it had been <u>prophesied</u> among them that Christ should <u>show</u> himself unto them after his ascension into heaven.

13 And it came to pass that the Lord spake unto them saying:

14 Arise and come forth unto me, that ye may <u>thrust</u> your hands into my side, and also that ye may <u>feel</u> the prints of the nails in my hands and in my feet, that ye may know that I am the <u>God</u> of Israel, and the God of the whole <u>earth</u>, and have been slain for the sins of the world.

15 And it came to pass that the multitude went forth, and thrust their hands into his side, and <u>did</u> feel the prints of the nails in his hands and in his feet; and this they did do, going forth one by one until they had all gone forth, and did see with their eyes and did feel with their hands, and did know of a surety and did bear record, that it was he, of whom it was written by the prophets, that should come.

16 And when they had all gone forth and had witnessed for themselves, they did cry out with one accord, saying:

17 Hosanna! Blessed be the name of the Most High God! And they did fall down at the feet of Jesus, and did worship him.



Prophecies



Zechariah 9:

9 Rejoice greatly, O <u>daughter</u> of Zion; shout, O daughter of Jerusalem: behold, thy <u>King</u> cometh unto thee: he *is* just, and having salvation; lowly, and <u>riding</u> upon an <u>ass</u>, and upon a <u>colt</u> the foal of an ass.

Isaiah 53:

1 Who hath <u>believed</u> our report? and to whom is the arm of the Lord revealed?

2 For he shall grow up before him as a tender <u>plant</u>, and as a <u>root</u> out of a <u>dry</u> ground: he hath no form nor comeliness; and when we shall see him, *there is* no <u>beauty</u> that we should desire him.

3 He is <u>despised</u> and rejected of men; a man of <u>sorrows</u>, and acquainted with grief: and we hid as it were *our* faces from him; he was despised, and we <u>esteemed</u> him not.

4 Surely he hath <u>borne</u> our <u>griefs</u>, and carried our sorrows: yet we did esteem him stricken, smitten of God, and afflicted.

5 But he *was* <u>wounded</u> for our <u>transgressions</u>, *he was* bruised for our iniquities: the chastisement of our peace *was* upon him; and with his <u>stripes</u> we are <u>healed</u>.

6 All we like <u>sheep</u> have gone <u>astray</u>; we have turned every one to his <u>own</u> way; and the Lord hath laid on him the <u>iniquity</u> of us all.

7 He was <u>oppressed</u>, and he was <u>afflicted</u>, yet he <u>opened</u> not his mouth: he is brought as a <u>lamb</u> to the <u>slaughter</u>, and as a sheep before her shearers is dumb, so he openeth not his mouth.

8 He was taken from prison and from judgment: and who shall declare his <u>generation</u>? for he was cut off out of the land of the living: for the <u>transgression</u> of my people was he stricken.

9 And he made his grave with the <u>wicked</u>, and with the rich in his <u>death</u>; <u>because</u> he had done no <u>violence</u>, neither *was any* <u>deceit</u> in his mouth.

10 ¶ Yet it pleased the Lord to <u>bruise</u> him; he hath put *him* to grief: when thou shalt make his soul an <u>offering</u> for sin, he shall see *his* <u>seed</u>, he shall prolong *his* days, and the <u>pleasure</u> of the Lord shall prosper in his hand.

11 He shall see of the travail of his soul, *and* shall be satisfied: by his <u>knowledge</u> shall my righteous <u>servant</u> justify many; for he shall <u>bear</u> their iniquities.

12 Therefore will I divide him *a portion* with the great, and he shall divide the spoil with the strong; because he hath poured out his soul unto <u>death</u>: and he was numbered with the <u>transgressors</u>; and he bare the sin of many, and made <u>intercession</u> for the transgressors.

Isaiah 6:

9 And he said, Go, and tell this people, <u>Hear</u> ye indeed, but <u>understand</u> not; and see ye indeed, but <u>perceive</u> not.

10 Make the <u>heart</u> of this people fat, and make their ears heavy, and <u>shut</u> their eyes; lest they see with their eyes, and hear with their ears, and understand with their heart, and convert, and be healed

Isaiah 56:

7 Even them will I bring to my holy <u>mountain</u>, and make them joyful in my <u>house</u> of <u>prayer</u>: their burnt offerings and their sacrifices *shall be* <u>accepted</u> upon mine altar; for mine <u>house</u> shall be called an house of prayer for <u>all people</u>.

Psalm 78:

1 Give <u>ear</u>, O my people, *to* my law: incline your ears to the words of my mouth. 2 I will open my mouth in a <u>parable</u>: I will utter dark sayings of old:

Passover Scriptures:

Account of the First Passover



Exodus 12: 1-42

1 And the LORD spake unto Moses and Aaron in the land of Egypt, saying,

2 This month shall be unto you the beginning of months: it shall be the first month of the year to you.
3 Speak ye unto all the congregation of Israel, saying, In the tenth day of this month they shall take to them every man a lamb, according to the house of their fathers, a lamb for an house:
4 And if the household be too little for the lamb, let him and his neighbor next unto his house take it according to the number of the souls; every man according to his eating shall make your count for the lamb.

5 Your lamb shall be without blemish, a male of the first year: ye shall take it out from the sheep, or from the goats:

6 And ye shall keep it up until the fourteenth day of the same month: and the whole assembly of the congregation of Israel shall kill it in the evening.7 And they shall take of the blood, and strike it on the two side posts and on the upper door post of the houses, wherein they shall eat it.

8 And they shall eat the flesh in that night, roast with fire, and unleavened bread; and with bitter herbs they shall eat it.

9 Eat not of it raw, nor sodden at all with water, but roast with fire; his head with his legs, and with the purtenance thereof.

10 And ye shall let nothing of it remain until the morning; and that which remaineth of it until the morning ye shall burn with fire.

11 And thus shall ye eat it; with your loins girded, your shoes on your feet, and your staff in your hand; and ye shall eat it in haste: it is the LORD's passover.

12 For I will pass through the land of Egypt this night, and will smite all the firstborn in the land of Egypt, both man and beast; and against all the gods of Egypt I will execute judgment: I am the LORD.

13 And the blood shall be to you for a token upon the houses where ye are: and when I see the blood, I will pass over you, and the plague shall not be upon you to destroy you, when I smite the land of Egypt.

14 And this day shall be unto you for a memorial; and ye shall keep it a feast to the LORD throughout your generations; ye shall keep it a feast by an ordinance for ever.

15 Seven days shall ye eat unleavened bread; even the first day ye shall put away leaven out of your houses: for whosoever eateth leavened bread from the first day until the seventh day, that soul shall be cut off from Israel.

16 And in the first day there shall be an holy convocation, and in the seventh day there shall be an holy convocation to you; no manner of work shall be done in them, save that which every man must eat, that only may be done of you.

17 And ye shall observe the feast of unleavened bread; for in this selfsame day have I brought your armies out of the land of Egypt: therefore shall ye observe this day in your generations by an ordinance for ever. 18 In the first month, on the fourteenth day of the month at even, ye shall eat unleavened bread, until the one and twentieth day of the month at even.

19 Seven days shall there be no leaven found in your houses: for whosoever eateth that which is leavened, even that soul shall be cut off from the congregation of Israel, whether he be a stranger, or born in the land. 20 Ye shall eat nothing leavened; in all your habitations shall ye eat unleavened bread.

21 Then Moses called for all the elders of Israel, and said unto them, Draw out and take you a lamb according to your families, and kill the passover.

22 And ye shall take a bunch of hyssop, and dip it in the blood that is in the basin, and strike the lintel and the two side posts with the blood that is in the basin; and none of you shall go out at the door of his house until the morning.

23 For the LORD will pass through to smite the Egyptians; and when he seeth the blood upon the lintel, and on the two side posts, the LORD will pass over the door, and will not suffer the destroyer to come in unto your houses to smite you.

24 And ye shall observe this thing for an ordinance to thee and to thy sons for ever.

25 And it shall come to pass, when ye be come to the land which the LORD will give you, according as he hath promised, that ye shall keep this service.

26 And it shall come to pass, when your children shall say unto you, What mean ye by this service?

27 That ye shall say, It is the sacrifice of the LORD's passover, who passed over the houses of the children of Israel in Egypt, when he smote the Egyptians, and delivered our houses. And the people bowed the head and worshipped.

28 And the children of Israel went away, and did as the LORD had commanded Moses and Aaron, so did they.

29 And it came to pass, that at midnight the LORD smote all the firstborn in the land of Egypt, from the firstborn of Pharaoh that sat on his throne unto the firstborn of the captive that was in the dungeon; and all the firstborn of cattle.

30 And Pharaoh rose up in the night, he, and all his servants, and all the Egyptians; and there was a great cry in Egypt; for there was not a house where there was not one dead.

31 And he called for Moses and Aaron by night, and said, Rise up, and get you forth from among my people, both ye and the children of Israel; and go, serve the LORD, as ye have said.

32 Also take your flocks and your herds, as ye have said, and be gone; and bless me also.

33 And the Egyptians were urgent upon the people, that they might send them out of the land in haste; for they said, We be all dead men.

34 And the people took their dough before it was leavened, their kneading troughs being bound up in their clothes upon their shoulders.

35 And the children of Israel did according to the word of Moses; and they borrowed of the Egyptians jewels of silver, and jewels of gold, and raiment:

36 And the LORD gave the people favour in the sight of the Egyptians, so that they lent unto them such things as they required. And they spoiled the Egyptians.

37 And the children of Israel journeyed from Rameses to Succoth, about six hundred thousand on foot that were men, beside children.

38 And a mixed multitude went up also with them; and flocks, and herds, even very much cattle.

39 And they baked unleavened cakes of the dough which they brought forth out of Egypt, for it was not leavened; because they were thrust out of Egypt, and could not tarry, neither had they prepared for themselves any victual.

40 Now the sojourning of the children of Israel, who dwelt in Egypt, was four hundred and thirty years.

41 And it came to pass at the end of the four hundred and thirty years, even the selfsame day it came to pass, that all the hosts of the LORD went out from the land of Egypt.

42 It is a night to be much observed unto the LORD for bringing them out from the land of Egypt: this is that night of the LORD to be observed of all the children of Israel in their generations.

3 The sorrows of death compassed me, and the ^apains of ^bhell gat hold upon me: I found trouble and sorrow.

11 They compassed me about; yea, they compassed me about: but in the name of the Lord I will destroy them.

12 They compassed me about like ^a<u>bees</u>; they are quenched as the fire of thorns: for in the name of the Lord I will destroy them.

13 Thou hast thrust sore at me that I might fall: but the Lord helped me.

14 The Lord is my ^astrength and song, and is become my ^bsalvation.

15 The voice of rejoicing and salvation is in the ^a<u>tabernacles</u> of the righteous: the right hand of the Lord doeth valiantly.

16 The right ^ahand of the Lord is exalted: the right hand of the Lord doeth valiantly.

17 I shall not die, but live, and declare the works of the Lord.

18 The Lord hath chastened me sore: but he hath not given me over unto death.

19 Open to me the gates of righteousness: I will go into them, and I will praise the Lord:

20 This gate of the Lord, into which the righteous shall enter.

21 I will praise thee: for thou hast heard me, and art become my salvation.

22 The ^a<u>stone</u> which the builders refused is become the head stone of the ^b<u>corner</u>.

23 This is the Lord's doing; it is marvellous in our eyes.

24 This is the day which the Lord hath made; we will arejoice and be glad in it.

25 Save now, I beseech thee, O Lord: O Lord, I beseech thee, send now prosperity.

26 ^a<u>Blessed</u> be he that cometh in the name of the Lord: we have blessed you out of the house of the Lord.

27 God is the Lord, which hath shewed us light: bind the sacrifice with cords, even unto the horns of the altar.

28 Thou art my God, and I will praise thee: thou art my God, I will exalt thee.

29 O give thanks unto the Lord; for he is good: for his mercy endureth for ever.

Easter Feasts

Holding a Passover Remembrance or Jerusalem Dinner on the Thursday night of Easter Week, or on Easter Sunday, can become a treasured family tradition. Your family might be interested in learning about the Jewish Seder, or you may prefer to do a simpler meal, reading the account of the first Passover in Exodus 12: 1-42 and the scriptures relating to the Last Supper in Luke 22:7-20. Other scriptures used in a modern Seder include the Hallal – Psalms 113-118 (See the Passover Scriptures Section).

Passover Remembrance Dinner:

Suggested Menu:

Roast Lamb

Unleavened Bread (Use matzos, make flat bread - recipe follows - or simplify by using whole wheat tortillas, though they are not really Kosher) Bitter Herbs: Horseradish, Onions, Cilantro, Fresh Ginger, Watercress, or Romaine Lettuce

(These foods were part of the first Passover meal.)

Grape Juice (Wine was included in the Last Supper.) Lentils, or Split Peas (Probably the "sop" mentioned in the account of the Last Supper.)



Karpas (Parsley) Bowls of Salt Water for Dipping Parsley (Represents the tears shed by the slaves in Egypt) Haroseth Hard Boiled Eggs Halva (These foods are part of the meal associated with a modern Jewish Seder.)

Yogurt Cheese, Goat Cheese or other Soft Cheese Bulgar Pilaf or Couscous Cucumber and Yogurt Salad Olives Mellon, Grapes, Figs, Dates, Pomegranates, Raisins, Nuts

(These foods are authentic to the time of Christ and may be an appropriate addition to a Jerusalem Dinner.)

Easter Day Dinner:

Suggested Menu:

Broiled Fish Honeycomb (Eaten by the Savior after His resurrection.)

Whatever other foods your family enjoys



Recipes:

(Each recipe serves 12 so multiply or divide to fit your needs.)

Flat Bread

2 cups whole wheat flour
½ tsp salt (Omit for this use. There is no salt in true unleavened bread.)
¼ cup melted butter or oil (may omit)

Mix together flour and salt. Add the butter or oil to the flour mixture, rub well between your fingers to make little balls. Add enough water to make a soft, pliable dough. Cover with a damp cloth and set aside for about one hour. Knead well until elastic. Break off golf ball size pieces of dough and roll them into very thin circles. Bake on a moderately hot, dry or lightly greased griddle, pressing dough down flat against griddle until it is lightly browned. Turn once and press down on other side until bread is done and "puffed"(like a tortilla.) Brush with melted butter. Serve hot and fresh.

<u>Bulgur Pilaf</u>

2 cups uncooked bulgur (coarsely cracked wheat)
1 medium onion, chopped
2-3 stalks celery, sliced
3 Tbs. butter
1 cup beef broth or chicken broth (or water and bouillon)
1 1/3 cups water
Salt and pepper to taste
Stir-fry bulgur, onion and celery in butter over medium heat, stirring frequently until onion is tender and bulgur is brown, about 5 minutes. Stir in remaining ingredients. Heat to boiling, stirring frequently. Reduce heat. Cover and simmer until liquid is absorbed, about 15 to 17 minutes.

Spiced Lentils

2 Tbsp. olive oil (or other vegetable oil)
2 onions chopped
3 cloves garlic chopped
2 ¼ quarts chicken or vegetable stock (or use water and bouillon)
3 cups dried red lentils
1 tsp. chili powder
½ tsp. chili powder
½ tsp. paprika
½ Tbs. coriander
½ Tbs. cumin
½ tsp. ground ginger or chopped fresh ginger
¼ cup chopped cilantro
Juice from ½ - 1 lemon

Sauté onions and garlic in oil. Add all other ingredients and bring to a boil stirring frequently. Reduce heat and simmer until lentils are tender (about 1 hour). Add a little more water as you go along if necessary.

Split Peas

1 lb. yellow split peas.
1Tbs. sugar
¹/₄ tsp. each: turmeric, cumin powder, coriander powder
1/8 tsp. ground ginger
salt and pepper to taste
Juice of ¹/₂ lemon
Wager (Made by popping 1/8 tsp. yellow or black mustard seeds and 1/8 tsp. cumin seeds in a little hot oil.)
Cut up green pepper, tomato and cilantro to taste.

Rinse split peas. Put them in a pot and add enough water to cover them by several inches. Boil until soft. Blend them. Add sugar, seasonings, lemon juice and wager. Cook on low heat for 15 minutes. Add green pepper, tomato and cilantro and heat through. Serve warm.

<u>Haroseth</u>

This fruit salad represents the mortar the Israelite slaves used to build for the pharaohs 6 apples peeled, cored and finely chopped (They should turn brown.) ^{1/2} cup almonds or walnuts, coarsely chopped ^{1/2} - 1 tsp. cinnamon 3 Tbs. grape juice, or enough to moisten completely 1 Tbs. sugar Toss all ingredients together

Cucumber and Yogurt Salad

3 large cucumbers peeled and gratedsalt and pepper to taste2-3 cloves garlic crushed1 lb. plain whole-milk yogurt2 Tbs. dried mint (may be omitted)Combine all ingredients. Chill for at least an hour.

Halva (Honey Cake)

½ cup butter softened
1/3 cup honey, warmed
2 eggs
1 cup uncooked farina (regular Cream of Wheat)
½ tsp. ground cinnamon
½ cup finely chopped almonds
¼ cup honey
¼ cup water

Preheat oven to 350. Butter a 9 by 9 inch cake pan. Cream butter. Add warmed honey and mix well. Beat in eggs one at a time. Gradually fold in farina, cinnamon and almonds. Pour into prepared pan and bake for thirty minutes. Remove from heat and cool for 15 minutes. Simmer honey and water for 10 minutes and pour over halva. Cool.
